### **MUSIC**

The Church of Saint John The Evangelist employs professional musicians on staff and strives to provide the highest quality music for these ceremonies.

As the Liturgy for Marriage is an act of worship, the music selections should be chosen from, and reflect, the church's own tradition and expression. It is not our custom to offer music that is secular in nature (e.g. popular songs or self-composed works) nor allow for prerecorded works within the ceremony. These music modes are more suitable for receptions.

All music for the service is subject to the discretion of the Director of Music, Dr. Michael Diorio, who will serve as the organist for your wedding or arrange for a suitable substitute.

If you wish to hire members of our choirs or additional instrumentalists, such as a trumpeter or string ensemble, the Director of Music will be able to assist with the contracting of the musicians.

#### **FEES**

If additional instruments or singers are requested those fees will be provided at that time. If another organist is requested, and approved, a bench feee of \$425 will be required for St John's organist, as the church's incumbent musician.
