- 5. The information below is for your review. There are no questions to be answered, but you are responsible to know what you may and may not do with your permit or license.

NY State Law: Junior Driver (Permit and Junior License)

- supervising driver: age 21 or older
- If you are under age 18, you must wait at least 6 months from the date you received your learner permit to schedule your road test.
- You may not drive with a learner permit on any street within a park in New York City or on any bridge or tunnel under the jurisdiction of the Tri-borough Bridge and Tunnel Authority on the Cross County, Hutchinson River, Saw Mill River, or Taconic State parkways in Westchester County or in a DMV road test area
- 5 am 9 pmPractice: 50/15
- If you have passed a road test and have a junior license (Class DJ, MJ or DJ/MJ), you may
 drive in Nassau and Suffolk counties between the hours of 6 AM and 9 PM without a
 supervising driver only directly between your home and your employment (you must
 carry appropriate proof of employment). You may not drive to school without a
 supervising driver.

Distracted Driving Penalties for probationary and junior drivers with a Class DJ or MJ driver license or learner permit:

The first conviction of a cell phone use or texting violation will result in a **suspension** of the driver license or permit for 120 days.

A second conviction within six months of the restoration of the license or permit (after the 120 day suspension is terminated) will result in a **revocation** of at least one year of a probationary license, or a **revocation** of at least one year for a Class DJ or MJ driver license or learner permit.
