Dear Students and Parents:

Welcome to A.P. World History; Modern! This is a very exciting and challenging Advanced Placement course. Advanced Placement (AP) classes are courses for students who have strong reading, writing, and thinking skills and who work well in an accelerated, demanding classroom environment. The difference between a regular history course and an AP alternative is that an AP class is structured like a college class. It moves at a faster pace, has higher expectations, and presents a more rigorous and analytical curriculum. In addition, AP classes are designed to develop students' abilities as critical thinkers and offer them a college level course with college-level expectations. Therefore, AP World History is an extremely challenging course, which will demand an unusual amount of time and energy. There is a large amount of material to cover, much work to do, and very little time available.

<u>Each student will be required to read and learn materials outside of the text that may not be</u> <u>covered in class, but may be covered on tests.</u> A textbook and review book (available to purchase in the school book store early in the school year) will be used in the course, along with other sources that will be assigned by the teacher. Students must be willing to openly discuss their verbal and written responses to the course work and active participation is essential.

The summer reading requirements outlined on the google classroom page are a prerequisite for AP World History. In other words, these assignments must be completed **before** students return to school in September, or their placement in the class will be jeopardized.
