From the desk of Fr. Chandra:

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

My dear brothers and sisters in the name of Lord Jesus Christ. In Today's Gospel, Jesus outlined the conditions of discipleship. He made the startling statement, "If anyone



comes to me and does not hate his father and his mother, his wife and children, his brother and sisters- yes, even his own life, he cannot be a disciple of mine." When an important lesson had to be taught, our Lord, often presented it in a startling manner, which immediately arrested people's attention. He once said I came to set fire on the earth, so we find many statements like this in the Bible.

1) Jesus must be preferred above kith and kin

Allegiance to Christ must be paramount in disciple's life, even above his near and dear ones. When a disciple of Christ hears the calls from all directions — from family, friends, world and from God, he has to obey to God's call. Under normal circumstances, parents' call must be respected and obeyed but when it comes in conflict with God's call, God's call is supreme.

2) Jesus must be preferred above our comforts

Following Christ is to woo misery and discomforts. Jesus never promised comforts and luxury to His disciples. He always made it clear that they would encounter difficulties because of their discipleship. But he promised that his presence would always go with them, guarding them, protecting them and consoling them.

3) Jesus must be preferred above our life

We cannot be His disciples if we do not love him above our life. Jesus said, "He who finds his life will lose it, but he who loses his life for my sake will find it" (Mt 10:39). So, when we are on this earth if we do not love Jesus more than all that we have then we lose the essential thing, that is eternal life. So, when we are here on this earth our focus should be on Him.

Therefore, my dear brother and sister, love Jesus more than anyone else in your lives.

May God bless us All.


