

Welcome

Fr. Stephen Sansevere, Pastor of St. Alphonsus in Hopewell, St. George in Titusville, and St. James in Pennington invites you to be a part of The Catholic Community of Hopewell Valley.

Dear Parishioners,

This Christmas season ends with the celebrating of the Baptism of the Lord. Over the last couple of weeks, we have witnessed the birth of Jesus in a stable, his presentation at the Temple, and his being lost for three days and his parents locating him again in the Temple speaking with the elders of the Jewish Faith. Today we witness, through the Gospel of Luke, his Baptism in the Jordan River. In a mere 15 days we go from a newborn Jesus, to a twelve-year-old Jesus, to a thirty-year-old Jesus. In all this rapid telling of Jesus' story, we see more than anything God's plan for the children he loves. Since that First Sunday of Advent, we have seen the creation of man in the form of Adam and Eve, to their fall from Grace in the Garden, to the sin that marks each of us, Original Sin. In all of this is God's plan to reclaim us through Abraham, Moses, and the prophets, right down to the ultimate plan of the Son of God being born through the Virgin Mary. The Baptism of the Lord is the beginning of the last leg of that journey that God has asked him to take for our sakes.

We are all baptized in Father, Son and Holy Spirit and, like Jesus, we are asked to make a journey in Jesus' footsteps all the way to the Cross. Jesus begins his journey at the River Jordan and each of us in our local churches when our parents presented us to God for baptism. Like Jesus, we begin our ministry here, like Jesus it will take us a little while to get going, but remember that 12-year-old boy in the Temple, it starts sooner than we think. At our baptism, the priest or deacon touches our ears and mouth and proclaims, "The Lord Jesus made the deaf hear and the dumb speak, may he soon touch your ears, to receive his word and your mouth to proclaim His faith to the praise and glory of God's name. Amen." From that moment on, whether it is the first time we kneel at our bedside praying, we are bringing God's word into the world. It is not our age, but our willingness to follow Jesus beginning at Baptism. So, one day we each will hear, "You are my beloved son and daughter, with you I am well pleased."

Special Note: The last couple of weeks were not as I planned for this my first Christmas as pastor here at the Catholic Community of Hopewell Valley. I had planned to be at all three churches on Christmas Eve and Day, but instead I wound up sidelined by COVID. I suddenly have a new appreciation of isolation and an even greater appreciation for the many prayers and wishes as I recovered. I am truly blessed to be the pastor here at the parishes of Saint James, Saint George and Saint Alphonsus. I thank my brother priests and deacons who made sure our community was cared for and to the parishioners for your prayers and cards. I also want to thank all of you who sent Christmas Cards and gifts. They also helped me while recuperating.

May God bless each of you with a Happy and Healthy New Year!


Religious Education

HOPEFUL BEGINNINGS

"Though your beginning was small, your latter days will be very great." Job 8:7

Happy New Year! And thus starts another moment to reflect on what a mess we truly are and how we're going to do whatever is necessary to become the most perfect person ever! At least for the first two weeks of the New Year.

Resolutions aren't always very easy to follow up on. This is especially true for those who are addicted to alcohol or other drugs, most notably nicotine. There's a reason the word addiction is used because drugs are extremely difficult to give up. Ask any former smoker how they did it and you'll probably hear about the many years of struggle before finally being successful. The same is true for alcohol and other drugs. Not only do the drugs affect the reasoning process necessary to becoming clean and sober, but there are also the social factors to deal with as well. For someone who is used to having a small drink before dinner – just one because it's the thing to do – before having far too many after dinner, breaking that pattern isn't easy. It takes a determined effort. Which is where support groups come into play.

Alcoholics Anonymous is certainly the most known. Others such as Narcotics Anonymous and Nicotine Anonymous are also very important. As are groups such as Al-Anon and Nar-Anon and Families Anonymous for those who live with or care about an addicted person. One of the principal tenets of these programs is "One day at a time." Living life this way, can, as the author of Job wrote, have small beginnings, but by living in this way, latter days will indeed be great. Long term sobriety or many years of being smoke free doesn't happen overnight. It takes work, and patience, and usually lots of prayer. That's why another tenet of these groups is to turn one's life over to the care of God.

The Hope ministry can direct you to where these meetings take place and if needed, will accompany you to a meeting as you become familiar with them. We will also talk with you, in confidence, as you try and keep your resolution this year. And as always, we will pray with you.




