The Service of Tenebrae follows a tradition of the Church dating back to the eighth century. From Latin, the Word Tenebrae means "darkness" and commemorates the final hours of our Lord's life on earth, as He suffered death upon the Cross. In the early Church, the service of Tenebrae was celebrated on Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday of Holy Week. During the service, seven candles that have been placed in the sanctuary are gradually extinguished. This is done to symbolize the fading loyalty of the disciples and friends of Jesus. The Church lights are also gradually dimmed during the service portraying the diminishing light of the world as Christ was departing from it. At the conclusion of the service, the congregation departs in darkness and silence.

**COMMUNION TO THE SICK** is taken by Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist on a regular basis to those confined to their homes. Please call the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM is celebrated on most Sundays at 1:30 PM (not during Lent). A family must be registered in the parish, attend the baptismal preparation class, and cooperate with the regulations established by the parish. Our baptismal class is temporarily on held Please call the Parish Center to register any time during your pregnancy.

**THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION** is celebrated on Saturday between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM in the Chapel or by appointment.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION is celebrated once a year, here at St. Augustine. A candidate must successfully complete our Religious Education program. Adult Confirmation is held on Pentecost Sunday and any interested adults should contact the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK is administered at home to any Catholic who is seriously ill. Please call the Parish Center. Any parishioner admitted to a local hospital should contact the Catholic Hospital Chaplain through the hospital. A family member should contact the parish when someone is admitted to the hospital. We will gladly pray for any members who are sick, whether at home or in the hospital, at our Sunday Masses; however, it is necessary for the family to "request" it.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY is celebrated by the Pastor or one of our deacons. Weddings may be scheduled on Friday evening, Saturday, or Sunday afternoon. Only a ceremony is permitted on Sunday. The pastor will confirm the date so couples should contact the Parish Center at least ONE YEAR in advance. All the necessary information will be sent to you. One must be a registered member of the parish.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS and RELIGIOUS LIFE: If you are considering serving God as a priest, deacon, or religious, you may contact your parish priest, deacon, or religious; or phone the Diocesan Office of Vocations at (732) 562-1990.


**Eucharistic Adoration/Devotion** is held Monday at 7:00 PM (**not on national holidays or during the summer**)

**Devotion in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus** is prayed on the First Friday of the month following the 9:00 AM Mass.




Archbishop Salvatore Pennacchio, the Apostolic Nuncio in Poland, Stanisław Cardinal Dziwisz, Archbishop Emeritus of Kraków, Jan Kopiec, Senior Bishop of the Diocese of Gliwice, Archbishop Giuseppe Mani, Archbishop Emeritus of Cagliari, Bishop Wiesław Śmigiel, Bishop of Toruń

Bishop Jan Kopiec, Bishop Emeritus of Gliwice, invoked the following words as the Liturgy of Consecration began:

"I too stand before you in this unique moment, dear brother Slawomir, to sincerely acknowledge in my own conscience that I served as well as I could, but I am filled with living hope that you will breathe new thought, new enthusiasm and the power of love into this—A church that deserves to be embraced with sincere love. This Church welcomes you and assures you of its willingness to accompany you on this path that you will show, and invites you to build a renewed covenant with God in our hearts."

# **Excerpt of Pope Francis' Nomination Letter**

"You're truly priestly as well as human virtues with which you distinguished yourself in the service in Rome, being the Postulator of the beatification and canonization process of John Paul II and in the diocese of Toruń, truly testify to your strong pastoral and Christian spirit, devoted to the good of the Church and of human souls. Therefore, acting by Our Apostolic Authority, and having heard the opinion of the Dicastery for Bishops, We appoint you Bishop of Gliwice, with all the rights and obligations imposed at the same time, according to the Code of Canon Law."

# Chapel of the President of Poland Presidential Palace

#### Krakowskie Przedmieście 48/50, 00-071 Warszawa, Poland

The Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary Chapel is a place of prayers of the President, the First Lady, the ministers of the Chancellery and the invited guests. There are gifts from popes: John Paul II and Benedict XVI, on the walls as well as a cross cut in the remains of the World Trade Center towers destroyed on 2001. Beside the cross there is a plaque devoted to the attacks in New York with words of a psalm engraved: "Thou hast made the earth to tremble: thou hast broken it: heal the breaches thereof; for it shaketh". There are commemorative plaques in the floor, at the place where John Paul II and Benedict XVI prayed. On the wall there are plaques commemorating the officers of the Chancellery of the President and the National Security Bureau, who died in the catastrophe near Smolensk as well as of the President's chaplain, Fr. Roman Indrzejczyk. Also the peace light from Bethlehem given every year to the President by scouts is kept at the chapel.



#### Chrism Mass

#### Tuesday, April 4, 2023 Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi Metuchen – 4:00 PM

On Tuesday, April 4, 2023, Bishop James F. Checchio will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests of the Diocese. At the Mass, all priests make a Renewal of Commitment to Priestly Service, recommitting themselves to their Bishop and to their ministry to God and His People; the Bishop and all Priests then ask the people for a pledge of their prayerful support.

The Bishop will also bless and consecrate the Holy Oils, which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. The Oil of Catechumens is used to anoint infants and adults before their Baptism; the Oil of the Sick is used on the forehead and hands of the infirm in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; and Sacred Chrism is used to anoint the head of the newly baptized, the foreheads of *confirmandi*, the hands of a priest at his ordination, the head of a bishop at his ordination, and the altar and walls of new churches.

All are encouraged to join in-person (or watch via livestream), the ancient, grace-filled Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi in Metuchen at 4:00 PM.

Father Bob has announced beginning on Divine Mercy Sunday April 15/16 after consultation and sharing with Bishop Checchio we will restore the reception of the

Precious Blood (of course optional) at Mass. With this joyous news, it is now a good time to begin to serve as an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist and join our ministry.

There will be a training session for the new Eucharistic Ministers. This will give you the privilege of giving the Eucharist to your sisters and brothers in Christ at Mass, as well as bringing Holy Communion to the sick. All Active Parishioners are welcome to join. Our most recent group of new Eucharistic Ministers are either single young (under 30) adults, or moms with young children. If you are married, you must have been married in the Church.
