COMMUNION TO THE SICK is taken by Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist on a regular basis to those confined to their homes. Please call the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM is celebrated on most Sundays at 1:30 PM (not during Lent). A family must be registered in the parish, attend the baptismal preparation class, and cooperate with the regulations established by the parish. Our baptismal class is temporarily on held Please call the Parish Center to register any time during your pregnancy.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION is celebrated on Saturday between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM in the Chapel or by appointment.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION is celebrated once a year, here at St. Augustine. A candidate must successfully complete our Religious Education program. Adult Confirmation is held on Pentecost Sunday and any interested adults should contact the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK is administered at home to any Catholic who is seriously ill. Please call the Parish Center. Any parishioner admitted to a local hospital should contact the Catholic Hospital Chaplain through the hospital. A family member should contact the parish when someone is admitted to the hospital. We will gladly pray for any members who are sick, whether at home or in the hospital, at our Sunday Masses; however, it is necessary for the family to "request" it.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY is celebrated by the Pastor or one of our deacons. Weddings may be scheduled on Friday evening, Saturday, or Sunday afternoon. Only a ceremony is permitted on Sunday. The pastor will confirm the date so couples should contact the Parish Center at least ONE YEAR in advance. All the necessary information will be sent to you. One must be a registered member of the parish.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS and RELIGIOUS LIFE: If you are considering serving God as a priest, deacon, or religious, you may contact your parish priest, deacon, or religious; or phone the Diocesan Office of Vocations at (732) 562-1990.



All three readings today mention the reception and action of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation in the Spirit complete Christian initiation in Samaria. Jesus, the model of Christian behavior, was brought to risen life in the Spirit. He bestows the Spirit of Truth on those who keep His Commandments. As we approach the Eucharist, let us thank God for His gracious gift.

In the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Philip goes to Samaria, proclaiming Jesus and working signs. Peter and John go there to lay hands on the newly baptized. In the second reading, Peter urges proper Christian conduct in imitation of Christ. In Jesus' farewell discourse, He promises to give the Spirit and to return soon. The disciples must keep His Commandments.







Grotto of Our Lady of Grace



In honor of the 60th Anniversary of Saint Augustine School, we are pleased to announce the creation of Our Lady of Grace Grotto surrounding the statue of Mary, Our Mother located in front of our School. The stonework will be identical to the pedestal of the Resurrected Christ and Our Lady of Fatima. The design of the Grotto will be similar to the wooden surround of Our Lady of Fatima statue. The stone work will be completed by Mike Graziani, owner of Progressive Landscaping and a 1989 graduate of St. Augustine of Canterbury School. Construction will begin in mid-June, 2023, once the school year has ended.

The names of those memorialized will be placed on the grounded pillars of the grotto.

Law Day with Judge Esther Salas

at United States District Court, District of New Jersey, Newark, NJ

On Monday, May 1, the students of St. Augustine of Canterbury middle school took a field trip to the Federal Courthouse in Newark, NJ to visit the Courtroom of US District Judge, the Honorable Esther Salas. Judge Salas





graciously planned a jam-packed 2 hour program to educate the students on the policies and procedures of the district judiciary. She also brought in an amazing lineup of professionals of the judiciary to help give the students a unique and in-depth perspective about what really happens in the federal courtroom.

The students were first treated to demonstrations by the US Marshals Service. The US Marshals are tasked with apprehending federal fugitives and executing federal protective services of federal witnesses and members of the Judicial Branch. The Marshals took some of their gear, including a protective vest, ballistics helmet and shield and dressed some of the students to give them an idea what it's like to "go to work" as a

US Marshal. The Marshals also put on a canine bomb-sniffing demonstration with Canine Grover, a three year-old black Labrador. While Grover was able to steal the hearts of the students and adults alike, he was also able to amaze his audience by tactfully identifying





bomb-related substances without error. After the demonstration, Grover went around the courtroom to greet as many humans as he could.

The students were then given a presentation by members of the Assistant US Attorneys Office and the Federal Public Defender. Both parties were informative about their roles in both prosecuting and defending federal defendants. While their relationship in the courtroom is designed to be adversarial, the Assistant US Attorneys and the Public Defender both highlighted the immense respect they have for each other and the high-level of collegiality that exists outside the courtroom.

One of the missing pieces that many people don't get to see in the judicial process is the pretrial work that goes on before a case makes it to the courtroom. Federal Pretrial Services are tasked with investigating and supervising defendants. The officers are tasked with helping the court decide if defendants should be released or detained while awaiting trial and mitigating any risk that they might pose to the public. Most importantly, they see that there is an equitable administration of justice. The students also heard from a Federal Probation Chief who helps supervise offenders after they have been released from federal custody.

The entire morning was put together under the supervision of Judge Salas. At the end of the program, Her Honor gave beautiful closing remarks and thanked the St. As students for being so informed about court proceedings and for their exhibited maturity. Her poise, grace and leadership shined through as she so eloquently exclaimed why she is so invested in representing the Federal District Court. She believes in the core values of justice that are executed through the United States Constitution





and federal statutes. While she cannot proclaim her faith from the bench, it is beyond evident that everything Judge Salas does comes from a heart of love and a lens of her own faith journey. Even more important than her title as Judge, she will always first be mother to her son, Daniel Mark Anderl, who was tragically killed in July of 2020 while defending his mother and father. Daniel's memory will always live on through the works of his mother and the legislation that she and Daniel's father, Mr. Mark Anderl fought so hard to get passed; the Daniel Anderl Judicial Security and Privacy Act.


A History of Saint Florian


Saint Florian lived in the third century AD in the region of modern day Austria and Bavaria. He was the commander of the Roman Imperial Army. At that time, the Church's followers were experiencing an intense persecution. The Emperors sent and edict to all Roman provinces proclaiming that all followers of Christ be executed. The governor of where Florian was stationed was a vicious man named Aquilinus.

He began rounding up Christians in the noble town of Lauriacum and brought them before a judges tribunal where they would be tried and executed. When Florian heard of this he gave all his personal wealth to the poor, gathered forty of his soldiers and left to Lauriacum. When he reached the town he publicly declared himself a Christian and refused to worship pagan idols. He was seized by the governors' soldiers and savagely tortured. See that Florian could not be overcome by pain of the body, he was sentenced to die. They tied a large mill stone around his neck and hurled him from a bridge into a river to be drowned in order to terrify his followers. Saint Florian's body was recovered by a pious woman and given a proper burial. In 1138 Pope Lucius III gave several of Saint Florian's relics to King Casimir and the bishop of Krakow. Since that time, Saint Florian has been regarded as a patron of Poland. Many miracles of healing are attributed to his intercession. He is invoked as a powerful protector in times of danger from fire and water. It is said that Saint Florian stopped a town from burning by throwing a single bucket of water on the blaze; thus he became known as the patron saint of firefighters.





Father Bob, Canon of Saint Florian, was installed November 4, 2015, by Cardinal Stanislaus Dziwisz in the Basilica of St. Florian, Krakow, Poland.

The Basilica of St. Florian, Krakow, Poland St Florian Church was the second parish served by St John Paul II as a young priest. As Pope, he visited the parish of St Florian and elevated it to a Basilica. He also restored the Canons which were created in the 1600's.
