COMMUNION TO THE SICK is taken by Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist on a regular basis to those confined to their homes. Please call the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM is celebrated on most Sundays at 1:30 PM (not during Lent). A family must be registered in the parish, attend the baptismal preparation class, and cooperate with the regulations established by the parish. Our baptismal class is temporarily on held Please call the Parish Center to register any time during your pregnancy.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION is celebrated on Saturday between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM in the Chapel or by appointment.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION is celebrated once a year, here at St. Augustine. A candidate must successfully complete our Religious Education program. Adult Confirmation is held on Pentecost Sunday and any interested adults should contact the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK is administered at home to any Catholic who is seriously ill. Please call the Parish Center. Any parishioner admitted to a local hospital should contact the Catholic Hospital Chaplain through the hospital. A family member should contact the parish when someone is admitted to the hospital. We will gladly pray for any members who are sick, whether at home or in the hospital, at our Sunday Masses; however, it is necessary for the family to "request" it.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY is celebrated by the Pastor or one of our deacons. Weddings may be scheduled on Friday evening, Saturday, or Sunday afternoon. Only a ceremony is permitted on Sunday. The pastor will confirm the date so couples should contact the Parish Center at least ONE YEAR in advance. All the necessary information will be sent to you. One must be a registered member of the parish.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS and RELIGIOUS LIFE: If you are considering serving God as a priest, deacon, or religious, you may contact your parish priest, deacon, or religious; or phone the Diocesan Office of Vocations at (732) 562-1990.

Bishop Varkey has graciously provided us with background information and several photos to give us an advance understanding of what the people's



needs are and how our support will be able to advance them in their lives.

Dear Reverend Canon Robert G. Lynam,

I'm happy to write to inform you that I'm looking forward to meeting you in the month of July to make the "Mission Appeal" on 22 and 23 July as you've informed me.

Madagascar is an island in the Indian Ocean situated 400 km from the East coast of Africa. It covers an area of 587,000 sq. km. and the fourth largest island in the world. There are nearly 29,000,000 inhabitants. The national languages are French and Malagasy. The main religion is Christianism.

The Diocese of Port-Berge is situated in the North-West of Madagascar in the region of Sofia. The Diocese of Port-Berge was created on June 19, 1994. It comprises of Three districts with an area of 23,367 sq. km. and it has a population of 827,118 of that 35,145 are Catholics, less than 4% of the population. 92% are animists, who don't practice any religion.




The diocese has 14 parishes or mission districts with 267 substations or catholic communities spread in the diocese. There are 36 priests and 57 Religious working in the

diocese. The diocese is a very rural diocese and 80% of the adults and 65% of the youth do not know

to read and write. 94% of the people are very poor and there are no good roads and we have to walk to visit the communities very many times. There are 330 catechists who help the priests in teaching the catechism to prepare the people to receive the sacraments. There are not many schools in the area.





After taking charge of the diocese of Port-Berge, I put the priorities of the diocese as follows:

- 1) Education
- 2) Education of faith (Catechism)
- 3) Development
- 4) Vocation



We have 42 schools in the Missions. Catechism is taught in the schools and many receive baptism after learning the

catechism. Schools are the privileged place of evangelization other than the adult baptisms. We have to make schools and search for the teachers to teach. Some times schools are used as churches since there are not enough church buildings in the diocese. Either to make schools or to make churches or to make houses for the priests or to make houses to the Religious or any other constructions, we have to search for the funds for building the necessary structures.



We have three dispensaries and one clinic run by the Holy Spirit Fathers and a Health Center and a Diocesan Pastoral center to train the people in different fields. We teach the people to take care of the Nature by planting

the young plants and avoiding wild fire which destroys the Nature. There are Seven Men Congregations and 11 Women Congregations in the diocese. The diocese has an Agricultural school to



teach the youngsters about agriculture and rearing the animals or birds. We have a minor seminary. Ours is the first evangelization in the area.



On the Divine Mercy Sunday, the Divine Mercy parish church was declared as the Diocesan Divine

Mercy Sanctuary in the presence of the Cardinal, the Apostolic Nuncio and other bishops with 65



priests and many Religious and more than 5000 Laity coming from 22 dioceses of Madagascar. We had a blessed graceful celebration and all thanked God for showing us His Divine Mercy.

I'm praying for all of you and May God bless you.



Sunday October 22, the Feast of Saint John Paul II



The Sisters of Life accompany those suffering after abortion on the journey of healing. We believe that God has a unique and beautiful plan of healing for each woman who contacts us.

Where can I begin?

Individual Accompaniment:

The Sisters are available to accompany you individually - in person, over the phone, or by email. Many who are suffering alone begin to experience a new peace as they unburden themselves with another in a confidential setting. Ongoing accompaniment is suited to each woman's needs and personal healing journey in the Lord.

Retreats and Gatherings:

We host Days of Prayer and Healing, monthly Gatherings, Weekend Retreats, and other special events. These provide opportunities for an ongoing encounter



with the loving mercy of God in a safe and sacred space and the solidarity and support of other women also on the healing journey. All retreats are led by the Sisters of Life and other women who have experienced both the suffering of abortion and the joy of healing in Christ. The retreats are directed



by faithful priests who have a sensitivity and a heart for those who suffer. They include testimonies, group sharing, personal prayer, an opportunity for the healing Sacrament of Confession, and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.



FINDING HEALING: A Testimony

For two months I had been carrying around a crumpled Hope & Healing pamphlet I found at the back of my church. After 29 years of silence and shame, I was finally ready to reach out. I emailed the Sisters and mentioned that I'd had more than one abortion. I was received with such compassion, such mercy, that I knew I had come to the right place.

My first retreat was on a freezing cold January morning. The whole way there, I was asking the Blessed Mother to help me. I felt so nervous that I almost turned around three times. When I arrived, I rang the bell thinking, "Here goes nothing." The door opened, and I was greeted by a Sister. She was so warm and welcoming, without an ounce of judgment or ridicule.

I walked into that chapel with the sun streaming in through the stained glass. I knelt down and breathed a sigh of relief. I felt a warm blanket of love wrap around me, as if I were home. I could have knelt there all day. For the first time in a very long time I knew I was safe, and I knew this was where I belonged to be healed. - Carey



Frequently asked questions about the Day of Prayer and Healing:

What if I have never told anyone about my abortion? Is it confidential?

The day is completely confidential, and we ask all who participate to honor this confidentiality. It is a very safe and healing environment.

What if I don't feel like sharing or talking with anyone? That is completely fine. There is no pressure to speak. There is much to gain from being part of a group where you can receive and listen to others.

What if I've had more than one abortion? God's mercy is infinite, and He never tires of forgiving us. We stake our lives on the truth that God is merciful, that His love is unconditional. He is a loving Father who never rejects anyone who comes to Him.


