COMMUNION TO THE SICK is taken by Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist on a regular basis to those confined to their homes. Please call the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM is celebrated on most Sundays at 1:30 PM (not during Lent). A family must be registered in the parish, attend the baptismal preparation class, and cooperate with the regulations established by the parish. Our baptismal class is temporarily on held Please call the Parish Center to register any time during your pregnancy.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION is celebrated on Saturday between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM in the Chapel or by appointment.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION is celebrated once a year, here at St. Augustine. A candidate must successfully complete our Religious Education program. Adult Confirmation is held on Pentecost Sunday and any interested adults should contact the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK is administered at home to any Catholic who is seriously ill. Please call the Parish Center. Any parishioner admitted to a local hospital should contact the Catholic Hospital Chaplain through the hospital. A family member should contact the parish when someone is admitted to the hospital. We will gladly pray for any members who are sick, whether at home or in the hospital, at our Sunday Masses; however, it is necessary for the family to "request" it.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY is celebrated by the Pastor or one of our deacons. Weddings may be scheduled on Friday evening, Saturday, or Sunday afternoon. Only a ceremony is permitted on Sunday. The pastor will confirm the date so couples should contact the Parish Center at least ONE YEAR in advance. All the necessary information will be sent to you. One must be a registered member of the parish.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS and RELIGIOUS LIFE: If you are considering serving God as a priest, deacon, or religious, you may contact your parish priest, deacon, or religious; or phone the Diocesan Office of Vocations at (732) 562-1990.

The time has arrived for another summer to end and a new school year to begin. It's quite hard to believe as it feels like just yesterday we celebrated the last day of school. However, it is with great joy and enthusiasm that we prepare to get this new year started. As we begin this journey on our familiar road, we must be cognizant that we live in New Jersey and our roads sometimes have potholes.

Last week. Father Bob and I were informed that JVS Industrial will be performing a culvert replacement project on Henderson Road at Brook Road. This means that the company is replacing the small "bridge" that lies adjacent to our property and as a result, Henderson Road between Route 27 and St. Augustine School will be closed for approximately 10 months. The project is expected to start mid-September. It will cause the need for traffic to be redirected to the south end of Henderson Road and Oakey Drive by way of Finnegans Lane.

We are grateful for the South Brunswick Police Department who are coordinating traffic plans to help ensure smooth arrival and departure from school. South Brunswick Police Department as well as the other shared services within the town have been notified of the road closing and have made accommodations to continue to provide our school with the highest level of services. The school will continue to provide you with updates on the project as soon as they are communicated to us.

Thank you for your understanding and your continued support of St. Augustine. As Father Bob said to his staff when he became Pastor almost 30 years ago, we will "flow with it!



An Invitation to Receive the Blessings of God.

We are invited by Jesus to follow Him with the promise that He does not want to add to our burdens; he wants to lighten them.

We read in Matthew's gospel, "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Mt. 11:28). Likewise, we experience God's love by resting with Jesus, who promised, "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Mt. 28:20). This is the ultimate rest, to know Jesus will always be with each of us.

But as proclaimed in the writing attributed to St. Teresa of Ávila,

Christ has no body but yours,
No hands, no feet on earth but yours,
Yours are the eyes with which He looks
Compassion on this world,
Yours are the feet with which He walks to
good,

Yours are the hands, with which He blesses all the world.

Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, Yours are the eyes, you are His body. Christ has no body now but yours, No hands, no feet on earth but yours, Yours are the eyes with which he looks compassion on this world.

Christ has no body now on earth but yours.

This is true for all who proclaim the teachings of Jesus. We have the opportunity to be catechists! We are able to invite everyone to celebrate the sacraments. Just as we are glad for those active in the Church, we also reach out the "hands of Christ" to the lost, disgruntled, confused, and those affected by Church hurt who need someone to ask them to meet Jesus in the sacraments so that they may lay down their burdens and rest.

Let us take this weekend to pray for all who are the teachers of Christ's teachings, that their efforts are not a burden, but a joy. Let us all find in the Holy Spirit creative ways to invite people to our faith community.

Eucharistic Adoration begins MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 18th

In the Eucharist, the Son of God comes to meet us; in Eucharistic adoration, we go to meet the Son of God. "Eucharistic adoration is simply the natural consequence of the Eucharist celebration, which is itself the Church's supreme act of adoration," past Pope Benedict explained. He encourages all of us "to make time for personal prayer before the Sacrament of the Altar," as well as other devotions dedicated to Eucharistic Adoration.

He reminds us that the "meaning of the Eucharist must include the call to pursue the path of penance," and thus, we need to partake of the sacrament of Reconciliation as part of the process of conversion.

Jesus as I come before You, in silence. I started to pray, but when I gazed up and saw You,

I forgot what I was going to say:

I remember now; I wanted to thank You for the blessings I receive each day and the special love and favors that You always send my way.

Look on me with pity, dear Jesus, for I want to do what is right to keep myself humble and holy and to say my prayers at night.

Jesus, I feel Your Presence around me as I kneel here to pray, I would like to spend more time with You, but I have to be on my way.

Music Ministry

With the Covid-19 pandemic, singing choirs and groups were stopped because singing, especially in choirs are called "super spreaders" of the disease. A choir in Washington state, had a rehearsal on a Thursday night, and within a

month more than forty percent were sick from the corona virus. Over the summer; I attended many webinars, online workshops and read many articles on the place of choirs in this time of pandemic. One group that keeps coming up as being the safest to make music are Handbell and Chime choirs.

At Father Tom Lanza's first Mass we moved the handbell tables to accommodate social distancing. It worked and added greatly to the joyous, festive celebration of Fr. Tom's first liturgy.

We have one handbell choir presently and one chime choir. So we are expanding them. We are starting a new Handbell Choir for Adults – called the Tintinnabulum (*Latin for Handbell*) Ringers. They will rehearse on Wednesdays from 7:30 – 8:30 p.m. in the Church. We are also starting a High-school Handbell Choir who will rehearse on Tuesdays from 5:30 – 6:30 p.m. We are also starting two children's Chime Choirs. They will rehearse on Tuesdays at 4:00 p.m. and 4:45 p.m. The school will still offer the junior high Chime Choir rehearsing during lunch on Thursdays.

All these groups – except our current Adult Handbell Choir, are starting at the beginning. You don't need to read music or have any particular skill – except know right from left.

If you ever thought about becoming a part of the Music Ministry, starting from the beginning; now is the time. Please contact Bill Berg, our Music Director to register, and to make sure we have handbell gloves ready for you at our first rehearsal. Those who have already Emailed Mr. Berg, do not need to "reregister". We warmly welcome you to be a part of the Bell music ministry.


CCD Classes Begin Wednesday, September 20, 2023

"Breaking Open The Word" returns!


Beginning Wednesday, September 27, 7:15-8:15 PM in the school cafeteria.
