MEDITATION FOR November 26, 2023

We celebrate Jesus, our king and true shepherd.

"To which king should I be loyal?" is not a question many of us face in modern times, but for both faithful Jews and followers of Jesus, it was a decision on which their lives could literally depend. We realize how relevant the question remains when we ask, "Who or what reigns in my life?" The answer determines both our present and future joy.

In the first reading, Ezekiel speaks for the Lord saying he will tend his sheep, give them rest, and seek out the lost. Paul writes to the Corinthians that *Christ has been raised from the dead*, and *in [him] shall all be brought to life*. In the Gospel, Jesus speaks to the disciples about the coming of the Son of Man. It will be a time when he sits upon his throne and *separates the sheep from the goats*.





ARE YOU A REGISTERED PARISHIONER?

If you recently moved into the area and have not yet registered in the parish, we encourage you to become a registered member.

Please ask an usher for a registration packet after Mass or stop by or call the Parish Office to obtain one.

Once registered, you will receive quarterly mailing of parish offertory envelopes. The use of an Offertory envelope helps us to track Mass attendance which affects your status as an active or inactive parishioner.

Mass attendance, *not the content of the offertory envelope*, is reviewed twice a year and a letter is sent to those who have not used their envelopes in that specified time period.

Once an individual reaches the age of 18 (even if still living in the Family home), they are considered to be an adult and need to register in the parish as an individual.

Why we sing what we sing

Today is the Solemnity of Christ the King.

This is a fairly new feast in the Liturgical Calendar. Pope Pius XI added it to the liturgical calendar in 1925. This feast ended the Liturgical year, being placed before the first Sunday of Advent.

Today Jesus says to us "When the Son of Man comes in His glory, He will sit on His glorious throne." This all sounds like a King, but look what Jesus does next: "He will separate them into two groups. Then the King will say, 'Come you who are blessed by My Father. For I was hungry and you gave me to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me to drink, naked and you clothed me, ill and your cared for me, in prison and you visited me. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you." That is why we are singing "Whatsoever You Do to the least of my people, that you do unto Me."

The corporal acts of mercy will be how our souls will be judged. During this holiday time, make sure you check out the "giving tree" in the gathering area, and donations to the food pantry. Our parish has so many ways to help live out our Gospel today. Let us take advantage of the opportunities to help the poor and needy in our midst.



Henderson Rd. Closure for Oakeys Brook Bridge Replacement NEW DATE FOR CLOSURE: November 27, 2023



THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION is celebrated once a year, here at St. Augustine. A candidate must successfully complete our Religious Education program. Adult Confirmation is held on Pentecost Sunday and any interested adults should contact the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK is administered at home to any Catholic who is seriously ill. Please call the Parish Center. 
