While they were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. Lord God,


let your blessing come upon us as we illumine this tree.

While doing so, each member of the family is kissed and wished a joyful feast. The other family members then greet one another in the same way.

The spiritual lesson in this age-old custom is the unity of the family—the main pillar of society. The bond of unity is the Christ-like charity that should exist amongst the members of the family. The father of the family is the link in the unbroken chain of One Body, One Bread, One Christ, and One Church. The family joins him in this eternal procession no matter where they are. For there is a universal longing by men to be always with one another, with God.







Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing.

In today's readings Isaiah, Paul, and John the Baptist rejoice because they have Good News. God is with them and working through

them. They are anointed, blessed, and sent to do God's will. On this Gaudete Sunday, we, too, find reason to rejoice. Let us rejoice in sharing the Good News of Christ.

In the first reading, Isaiah is anointed by the Lord and sent to announce a day of vindication by our God. In the second reading, Paul encourages the Thessalonians to always rejoice, pray, and give thanks. In the Gospel, John the Baptist testifies to the light and says he is the voice of one crying out in the desert, "make straight the way of the Lord."



"Rejoice always. Pray without ceasing. Give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of Stewardship God for you in Christ Jesus." – 1 Thessalonians 5:16 - 18

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.



Today we celebrate *Gaudete* Sunday or Rejoicing Sunday. We light the pink candle because Christmas is coming soon, the wait will soon be over. Every Mass has it's own entrance antiphon – this is the scripture that the opening hymn is based on. Years ago people gave at title to each Sunday Mass. The title came from the first Latin word of the day's antiphon.

The entrance antiphon for today is "Rejoice in the Lord always!" The Latin word for "rejoice" is "gaudete"; thus the reason for all the music with rejoice: "O Come O Come Emmanuel" (Rejoice, Rejoice, Emmauel Shall Come to Thee O Israel) We are also singing "On That Holy Mountain" this upbeat song is fitting for Advent, because that is why our Savior came to earth. There will be "no harm or ruin on the holy mountain". That is our final goal. That is why John the Baptist was preaching, to save souls. The choir is singing a beautiful anthem "Advent Glad Song" with the text "Heartily rejoice, rejoice, shout for joy O Zion". Imagine what our world would be like if all were people of rejoicing.


