- Students serve as broadcasters, as well as run technology, for the school's Knights Television Network (KTN), a high-tech studio where students share announcements, prayers, interviews and other school activities.

- A ramp provides access to a newly renovated Early Childhood wing that fosters exploration and creation. Teachers are specialized in early childhood along with aides who cultivate a nurturing and individualized approach to learning and problem solving.



In 2006 a detached building used as a garage and storage space was repurposed and renovated for classrooms through the generosity of the Saint Augustine of Canterbury chapter of the Knights of Columbus and christened "Canterbury Corner."

COMMUNION TO THE SICK is taken by Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist on a regular basis to those confined to their homes. Please call the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM is celebrated on most Sundays at 1:30 PM (not during Lent). A family must be registered in the parish, attend the baptismal preparation class, and cooperate with the regulations established by the parish. Our baptismal class is temporarily on hold. Please call the Parish Center to register any time during your pregnancy.

THE SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION is celebrated on Saturday between 11:30 AM and 12:30 PM in the Chapel or by appointment.

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION is celebrated once a year, here at St. Augustine. A candidate must successfully complete our Religious Education program. Adult Confirmation is held on Pentecost Sunday and any interested adults should contact the Parish Center.

THE SACRAMENT OF THE SICK is administered at home to any Catholic who is seriously ill. Please call the Parish Center. Any parishioner admitted to a local hospital should contact the Catholic Hospital Chaplain through the hospital. A family member should contact the parish when someone is admitted to the hospital. We will gladly pray for any members who are sick, whether at home or in the hospital, at our Sunday Masses; however, it is necessary for the family to "request" it.

THE SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY is celebrated by the Pastor or one of our deacons. Weddings may be scheduled on Friday evening, Saturday, or Sunday afternoon. Only a ceremony is permitted on Sunday. The pastor will confirm the date so couples should contact the Parish Center at least ONE YEAR in advance. All the necessary information will be sent to you. One must be a registered member of the parish.

THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY ORDERS and RELIGIOUS LIFE: If you are considering serving God as a priest, deacon, or religious, you may contact your parish priest, deacon, or religious; or phone the Diocesan Office of Vocations at (732) 562-1990.

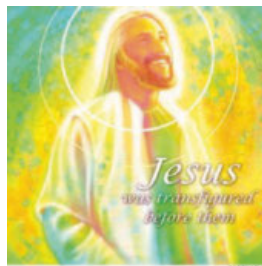

We have a God who did not hold back anything, not even his beloved Son, to lead us to the goodness he desires for us.

Pilgrimage to Rome 2024

I have shared with you my trip to Rome/the Vatican from May 6 to 14 with my good friend Bobby and his son Anthony, aged 16. Anthony is my Godson and I promised him a trip to Rome after his confirmation. On May 11, 2022, Anthony was Confirmed by Bishop James Checchio here at St. Augustine's.

On May 8, in honor of my 40th Anniversary of priestly ordination, I am blessed to have a special luncheon at the Vatican with the holy father and the entire staff of Domus Sanctae Marthae along with the Religious Teachers Filippini with Mother Ascenza attending.

Recently, the Vatican sent notice to me that I have been confirmed for an additional trip at the end of May from May 26 to June 4. This trip is to celebrate a special event at the Vatican with fellow priests. For this trip I will also be staying at the Vatican. So May will be a very busy month. I wanted to share with you these joyous trips so if you don't see me you know where I am: my second home!!!

For both pilgrimages—May 6 to the 14th and May 26 to June 4—I am blessed to have Vatican approval to celebrate special Masses in the Grotto of Saint Peter, at the Clementine Chapel/the Tomb of Saint Peter, the Polish Chapel, the Patron of the Blessed Mother of Poland, and the Lithuanian Chapel, in honor of Our Lady of Mercy, along with Mass at the Tomb of Saint John Paul II.

Please know that all of you will be remembered during each Mass for your special intentions.

My Continuing Health Journey

At the recommendation of my dermatologist, I cannot postpone the face peel procedure any longer. It should be scheduled, God willing, on March 6... And then the healing process will take place.

THE EASTER MYSTERY

From His Wounded Side We Were Born

This is the time of year when we begin to look forward to warmer weather and spring vacations. It is also the time of year when we pause to see where we've been and where we should be going. It is the time to recommit ourselves to the Lord through Almsgiving.

Throughout the Lenten season, you will notice a basket with decorated index cards by the cross of St. Lucy in our gathering area. Listed on each card is a suggestion of a necessary item to be purchased for an organization that helps those in need. These items will be collected after all the weekend Masses on:

February 24/25, March 2/3, March 9/10 and March 16/17.

This is our way as a parish to reach out to others through "Almsgiving", one of the spiritual blessings of our Lenten journey.

All donations need to be in by Sunday, March 17th 2024.

Anything received after that date will be given to our Food Pantry.

Music In The Church



Today we continue our Lenten journey. For today we celebrate the Second Sunday in Lent. The Second Sunday gives us the reason why we are doing all this fasting, almsgiving and prayer: We will gain our "transfigured body" when we die at the end

of time; in heaven. It will be so amazing we, like the apostles in the Gospel today will say "Lord it is good for us to be here." We will not want to leave heaven. The experience will be so wonderful. Therefore today, we get a glimpse of heaven.

This is also another confirmation from God in heaven that Jesus is the one and only Son of God. That's why we are singing "Tis Good Lord To Be Here" and "Transfigure Us O Lord." Plus this is the "Glory Day of Lent" when we see Christ resurrected and in his transfigured body. Thus we are singing "The Glory of These Forty Days".

Have you noticed? We do not sing (or say) the *Gloria* in Lent? The *Gloria* is the hymn about the angels singing with great joy about the birth of Christ. It was first added to the Mass by St. Hilary in 347 AD. It was formally added to Christmas Midnight Mass by Pope Symmachus in 498 AD. Then it spread to the Christmas Season. The Gloria was then added to the Easter Season in the seventh century. Then the Gloria gradually spread to the rest of the year. However being a hymn of extreme joyful praise; it was always removed from the Lenten and Advent liturgies. These penitential seasons were filled with much more reserved introspective music. There are two exceptions when the Gloria is sung during Lent: the Feast of St. Joseph, the foster father, and patron of the Universal Church - March 19, and the feast of the Annunciation - March 25. Those days being filled with great joy, the Gloria is allowed to be sung. Remember the quote from the General Instruction on the Roman Missal # 313 "with the exception of *Laetare* Sunday and Solemnities (March 25) and Major Feasts (March 19)."



SLEEPING BAGS FOR THE HOMELESS

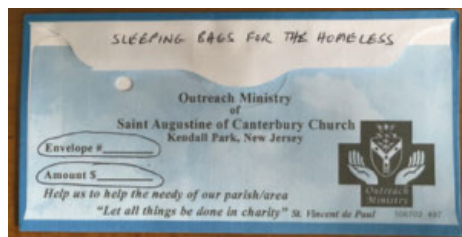
In November, 2023, our Outreach Ministry purchased 26 sleeping bags for the homeless in New

ARE YOU A REGISTERED PARISHIONER?

If you recently moved into the area and have not yet registered in the parish, we encourage you to become a registered member.

Please ask an usher for a registration packet after Mass or stop by or call the Parish Office to obtain one. Once registered, you will receive quarterly mailing of parish offertory envelopes. The use of an Offertory envelope helps us to track Mass attendance which affects your status as an active or inactive parishioner.

Mass attendance, *not the content of the offertory envelope*, is reviewed twice a year and a letter is sent to those who have not used their envelopes in that specified time period.

Once an individual reaches the age of 18 (even if still living in the Family home), they are considered to be an adult and need to register in the parish as an individual.
