That the breath of the Holy Spirit engender a new missionary "spring" in the church.

#### Rosary Meditations for Respect Life Month: Joyful

<u>Annunciation:</u> Mary is troubled by the angel's greeting, yet rejoices to do God's will. Let us pray that those who are troubled by their pregnancy may have the grace to trust in God's will.

<u>Visitation:</u> John the Baptist leapt for joy in his mother's womb. We pray that people may realize that abortion is about children who are already in the world, living and growing in the womb, and are scheduled to be killed.

<u>Nativity:</u> The greatness of a person does not depend on size, for the newborn King is very small. Let us pray for an end to prejudice against tiny babies threatened by abortion.

<u>Presentation:</u> The Child belongs to God. Children are not the property of their parents, nor of the government. We belong to God alone.

<u>Finding of Jesus in the Temple:</u> The boy Jesus was filled with wisdom. Let us pray that all people may see the wisdom of the dignity of life, and understand that this teaching is not an opinion, but the truth.

The child to be born of you will be called holy, the Son of God, the fountain of wisdom, the Word of the Father on high. Through you, blessed Virgin, this Word will become flesh, so that even though, as he says: I am in the Father and the Father is in me, it is still true for him to say: "I came forth from God and am here."

In the beginning was the Word. The spring was gushing forth, yet still within himself. Indeed, the Word was with God, truly dwelling in inaccessible light. And the Lord said from the beginning: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction. Yet your thought was locked within you, and whatever you thought, we did not know; for who knew the mind of the Lord, or who was his counsellor?

And so the idea of peace came down to do the work of peace: *The Word was made flesh* and even now *dwells among us*. It is by faith that he dwells in our hearts, in our memory, our intellect and penetrates even into our imagination. What concept could man have of God if he did not first fashion an image of him in his heart? By nature incomprehensible and inaccessible, he was invisible and unthinkable, but now he wished to be understood, to be seen and thought of.

But how, you ask, was this done? He lay in a manger and rested on a virgin's breast, preached on a mountain, and spent the night in prayer. He hung on a cross, grew pale in death, and roamed free among the dead and ruled over those in hell. He rose again on the third day, and showed the apostles the wounds of the nails, the signs of victory; and finally in their presence he ascended to the sanctuary of heaven.

How can we not contemplate this story in truth, piety and holiness? Whatever of all this I consider, it is God I am considering; in all this he is my God. I have said it is wise to meditate on these truths, and I have thought it right to recall the abundant sweetness, given by the fruits of this priestly root; and Mary, drawing abundantly from heaven, has caused this sweetness to overflow for us.

#### Social Justice Corner

PREPARES is an organization started by Bishop Joseph Tyson and all the Bishops of Washington State.

We are "walking the journey," with low income families by supporting moms, dads, and children from conception to age 5. Some of these parents may be in crisis pregnancies, perhaps considering abortion, others may be raising children alone or without a healthy support network.

We are an umbrella for programs and services to support these pregnant and parenting families. Our services may include matching them with mentoring companions or providing for more immediate needs, like diapers and clothing.

We have been in Whatcom county since 2015 and have served 20 local families on a regular basis. We are starting to help refugee families brought here by the Archdiocese to Whatcom county. These families are in great need and extremely grateful for everything they receive. In the past, we have provided such items as: A dining room table, beds, highchairs, baby baths, bus passes, emergency gas, baby food, formula, and clothing.

We need volunteers to make gift bags and others to deliver them. If you want to join a rewarding ministry, please join us!

The Traveling Crib will be in our parish during the month of October. Besides baby items we especially need coats and warm clothing for boys and girls in sizes 2-5T.
