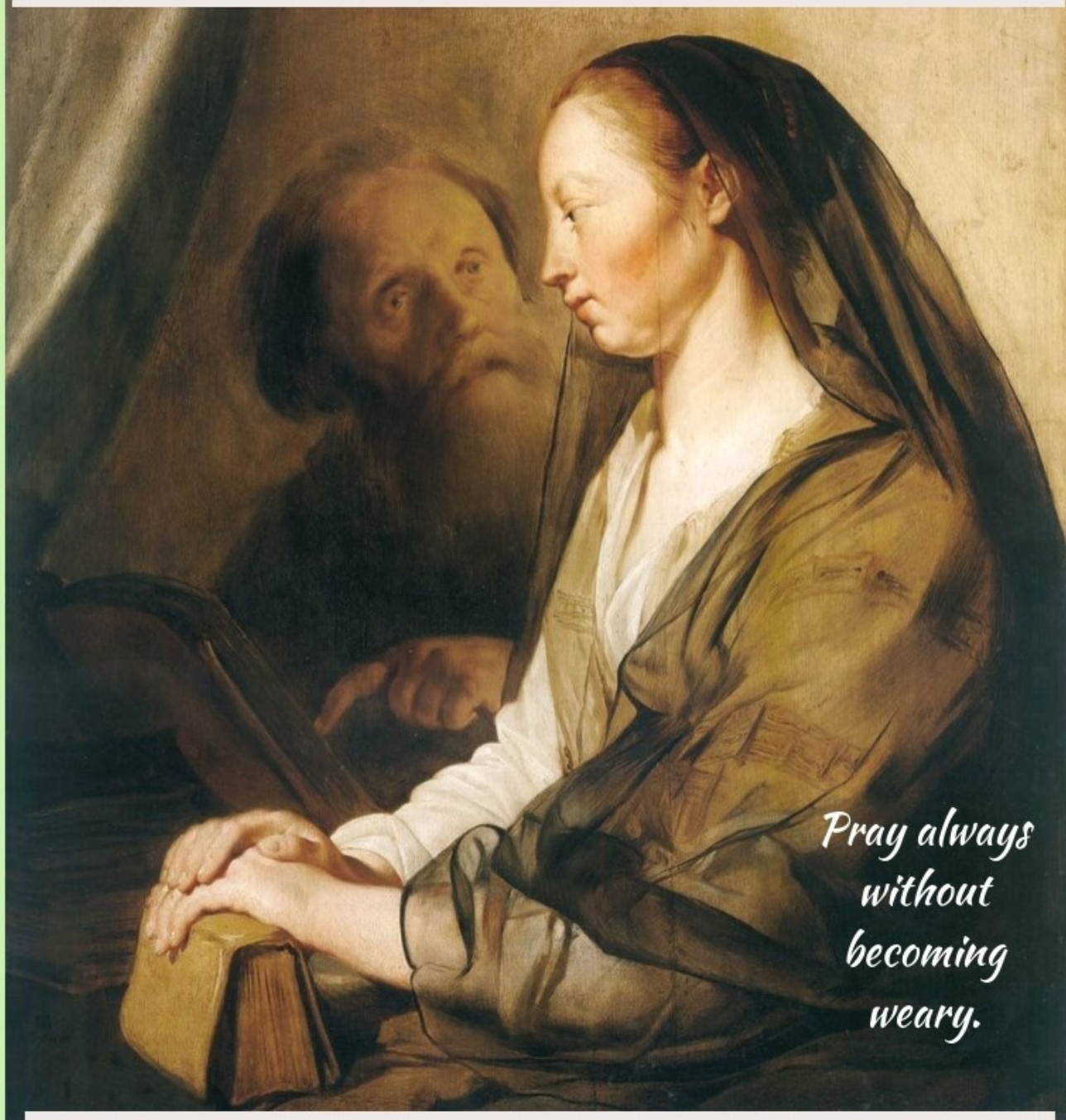

That the breath of the Holy Spirit engender a new missionary "spring" in the church.

Rosary Meditations for Respect Life Month: Luminous

Baptism in the Jordan: All are called to become adopted sons and daughters of God through baptism. We pray that children in the womb may be protected, so that they may be born and welcomed into the community by baptism.

Wedding at Cana: The new couple was blessed not only with wine, but with faith in Christ. Let us pray for strong marriages, rooted in the Lord, and open to the gift of life.

Proclamation of the Kingdom: Let us pray that these words of Jesus' public ministry may be heard by all who have committed abortion. May they know that the Lord calls them to conversion, and may they experience life-giving repentance.

The Transfiguration: May the eyes of all people be transformed, that they may see each and every human life as a reflection of the glory of God himself.

Institution of the Eucharist: *This is my Body, given up for you.* The Eucharist teaches us how to live and how to love. Let us pray that parents who sacrifice the babies for the sake of themselves may learn instead to put themselves aside for the sake of their babies.



Why do we turn to so many things to find what we should pray for? Why do we not say instead, in the words of the psalm: *I have asked one thing from the Lord, this is what I will seek: to dwell in the Lord's house all the days of my life, to see the graciousness of the Lord, and to visit his temple?* There, the beginning of one day does not mean the end of another; all days are one, simultaneously and without end.

So that we might obtain this life of happiness, he who is true life itself taught us to pray, not in many words as though speaking longer could gain us a hearing. After all, we pray to one who, as the Lord himself tells us, knows what we need before we ask for it.

Why he should ask us to pray, when he knows what we need before we ask him, may perplex us if we do not realize that our Lord and God does not want to know what we want (for he cannot fail to know it), but wants us rather to exercise our desire through our prayers, so that we may be able to receive what he is preparing to give us. His gift is very great indeed, but our capacity is too small and limited to receive it. That is why we are told: *Enlarge your desires, do not bear the yoke with unbelievers.*

The deeper our faith, the stronger our hope, the greater our desire, the larger will be our capacity to receive that gift, which is very great indeed. No eye has seen it; it has no color. *No ear has heard it*; it has no sound. *It has not entered man's heart*; man's heart must enter into it.

In this faith, hope, and love we pray always with unwearied desire. The more fervent the desire, the more worthy will be its fruit. When the Apostle tells us: *Pray without ceasing*, he means this: Desire unceasingly that life of happiness which is nothing if not eternal, and ask it of him who alone is able to give it. —St. Augustine, *Letter to Proba*

Social Justice Corner

"More women and girls consider abortion than you may realize. They are our relatives and friends, our babysitters, teammates, people who work with us and for us, married or unmarried. (...) When a woman is facing a difficult pregnancy, the reaction of the first person she tells tends to set the tone for her decision-making. How do we respond in a loving way that is life-affirming for both her and her baby? First, prioritize listening over speaking; ask her about her feelings, thoughts, values, beliefs, and wants. Help her set goals that extend beyond her due date to help her see her life beyond her pregnancy. Reassure her that she is not alone, and provide practical support." (uscbb.org)

At each daily Mass, we pray the Archdiocesan Prayer for Vocations, including these words: *Send workers into your great harvest so that the Gospel is preached, the poor are served with love, the suffering are comforted, and your people are strengthened by the sacraments.* May we ourselves be the ones who

- are pro-active in our child's school, offering curriculum and materials that can instill a pro-life worldview or intervening when the opposite is being taught;
- promote a proper response to miscarriage by recognizing the loss of an actual child—taking the remains, giving the baby a name, baptizing if possible, making reasonable efforts to give him or her a fitting burial;
- thank our pro-life doctors, encourage them to come alongside caring pregnancy centers in advisory settings, or to set the record straight when errors about healthcare are found in the media or in the popular culture.

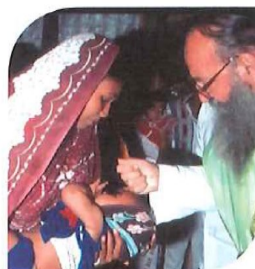
