## Rosary Meditations for Respect Life Month: Glorious

**Resurrection:** Christ has destroyed the power of death, and therefore the power of abortion. The outcome of the battle for life has already been decided: Life is victorious! Let us pray that all pro-lifers will spread this victory everywhere.

**Ascension:** Christ takes our human nature, given to us in the womb, to the heights of heaven. He shows us that human beings are made to be raised to heaven, not thrown in the garbage. Let us pray that the world may learn this truth and reject abortion.

**Descent of the Holy Spirit:** The Holy Spirit is the Advocate: He pleads our cause, for we cannot save ourselves. We pray that he will make us advocates for the babies, who cannot speak, write, vote, or protest.

**Assumption:** Mother and child belong together. We pray that society will see that it cannot love women while killing their children, and cannot save children without helping their mothers.

**Coronation:** The Church defends the dignity of women. We pray that people will understand that to be pro-life means to be pro-woman, and that to be pro-woman demands that we be pro-life.



Let us fix our gaze on the Father and Creator of the whole world, and let us hold on to his peace and blessings, his splendid and surpassing gifts. Let us contemplate him in our thoughts and with our mind's eye reflect upon the peaceful and restrained unfolding of his plan; let us consider the care with which he provides for the whole of his creation.

By his direction the heavens are in motion, and they are subject to him in peace. Day and night fulfill the course he has established without interfering with each other. The sun, the moon, and the choirs of stars revolve in harmony at his command in their appointed paths without deviation. By his will the earth blossoms in the proper seasons and produces abundant food for men and animals and all the living things on it without reluctance and without any violation of what he has arranged.

Yet unexplored regions of the abysses and inexpressible realms of the deep are subject to his laws. The mass of the boundless sea, joined together by his ordinance in a single expanse, does not overflow its prescribed limits but flows as he commanded it. For he said: *Thus far shall you come, and your waves will be halted here.*

The seasons, spring, summer, autumn, and winter, follow one another in harmony. The quarters from which the winds blow function in due season without the least deviation. And the ever-flowing springs, created for our health as well as our enjoyment, unfailingly offer their breasts to sustain human life. ### Social Justice Corner

This past weekend was the Cornerstone Catholic Conference, sponsored by the Archdiocese, and what an inspiring way to celebrate Respect Life Month! The theme was "United for Life and Justice," reminding us that we as Christians are called to work together, no matter our differences, to see and enhance the God-given dignity of all human life... even when other societal influences may tell us otherwise.

For me, there were two take-away messages: First, whatever we do must be rooted in our encounter and relationship with Jesus. As one speaker put it, "Christ is our cornerstone" upon which all else in our lives is built. He enlightens us and empowers us to do his work.

The second relates to the theme. All our work for life and justice is rooted in the inherent dignity of all human life as God's creation. We are called to protect all of life, no matter its stage, the mental or physical health of the person, the color of their skin, or the country from which they came. We are one Church, and working together, we can make a difference. As Bishop Caggiano said, as we face the issues of our day, "They are not problems to be solved, but people to be loved." Remembering that can transform our outlook!

The issue of divisions within our country and within the Church was also addressed. Bishop Caggiano challenged us to sit down together, truly listen to and respect each other, and work it out! Then, in unity, we can reach out to our world.

The conference was a blessing and a good reminder to all of us of who we are and how we are called to live as the Body of Christ.
