

A Letter from our Pastor

Dear Friends,

As most of you know, once the quarantine began in the middle of March, we here at Saint Timothy's began to tape the Sunday Mass every week so that the recording could be accessed each weekend on Facebook and on our parish website's homepage. During the Sacred Triduum --- Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday --- instead of taping the liturgies we livestreamed them, which means folks would be able to watch the liturgies live as they were taking place, as opposed to watching the recording of the liturgies at a later time. All of these broadcasts were very well received by our parishioners and friends and even by people who live far beyond the boundaries of Saint Timothy's. Many have offered their gratitude for being able to participate in the celebration of the liturgy in this remote manner, and so I very firmly believe that our efforts were well worth the time and work we put into them.

I also believe that recording the liturgies is not the ideal. It is much better to livestream, so that those watching, if they choose, can watch each liturgy in "real time," i.e., at the time it is taking place. The problem with livestreaming (if you need to hire someone to do it for you, which we did) is that it is much more expensive than simply recording, since there is much more effort and more equipment involved; this is the reason we only livestreamed during Holy Week.

I am very happy to tell you that, through the generosity of two benefactors and through monies we are receiving through a grant, we will be purchasing and installing equipment in our upper church so that we will be able to do our own livestreaming whenever we wish. This is an expensive endeavor, but in the end, will be well worth it, since we will be able to use the equipment whenever we choose. My goal is for us to be able to livestream the 9:15 Mass every Sunday as well as any other important liturgies throughout the liturgical year.

We are in the process of taking bids for this project from a few different contractors. Hopefully, within five or six weeks, the equipment will be installed and tested and the livestream will be up and running. I know that the finished product will be well-worth the wait.

I have made the decision that, for the time being, we will suspend the recording and broadcasting of the Sunday Mass. I realize that there are some folks who have not yet returned to Church for the "in person" celebration of the liturgy, and that some of these folks depend on the weekly broadcast of the recorded Mass. I apologize for the inconvenience, but I believe that, for several reasons, this is the right decision in light of our anticipated purchase and installation of the livestream equipment. As soon as possible, we will purchase and install our new system and have it up and running so that anyone who chooses can participate remotely in the celebration of the sacred liturgy.

In the meantime, there are a number of other parishes who livestream their Sunday Masses and make the link available on Facebook, including Saint Matthew's and the Cathedral-Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul. Also, the daily Mass is broadcast several times a day on television on the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN).

Thank you for your patience in this matter and for your kindness and patience always. I give thanks to God each day for your constant support to our great parish and to me personally.

Please know that you and those you love are daily remembered in my Masses and my prayers.



IMPORTANT GUIDELINES AS WE RETURN TO CHURCH

We remind you of our guidelines as we gather as a community of faith for Sunday Mass in light of the COVID-19 pandemic:

- a. Everyone is asked to wear a mask to church, that is, as you approach church, while you are in church, and when you leave church; obviously your mask will be removed when you come forward to receive Holy Communion;
- b. We ask everyone to sit only in the designated pews that are not roped-off;
- c. Please social distance from parishioners while entering and exiting the church;
- d. When in your pew, you may sit with your family members and/or the people with whom you live; if anyone else is in the same pew as you and your family, please social distance from them;
- e. Please try to keep a distance of six (6) feet from the person in front of you when coming forward to receive Holy Communion;
- f. The Communion procession will form and come forward as a single line (as opposed to the regular double line);
- g. The ushers will not be taking up the collection; I ask you to please place your church envelope/offering in one of the designated baskets (at the center of the church or at either end of the altar rail);
- h. Church bulletins are placed for your taking next to the collection baskets;
- i. Holy Water has been removed from the stoups for everyone's safety;
- j. It is strongly recommended that everyone receive Holy Communion in the hand for the time being;
- k. There are hand sanitizer dispensers located at all the entrances to the church, so that you may use them upon entering and exiting;
- l. The Church will be thoroughly sanitized after each Mass.

It is very important for everyone to remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still lifted in this Archdiocese for the time being; **therefore NO ONE is obligated to attend Mass even now that we are again open.** If you are not well or if you feel uncomfortable, please stay home! We will continue to record Mass and make it available on our Facebook page and on our website for the foreseeable future.





The CARIE LINE is a free telephone and online, one-on-one service that assists older adults and their caregivers identify and access needed services and supports. CARINE LINE Advocates offer options counseling, information, advocacy and education to help elders and caregivers identify and access resources on any issue an elder may be facing, including health insurance coverage, housing, health resources, nutritional support, long term care services, transportation, abuse and neglect, financial exploitation and many more. Requests for help come from older adults, their families and neighbors, as well as from social workers and other community service professionals who depend upon CARIE LINE for a prompt, caring, and reliable response.

Memorial Opportunities

- † Sanctuary candle: A sanctuary candle burns in both our upper and lower church to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. If you wish to have the sanctuary candles in the upper or lower church burn for a full week in memory of a loved one, please contact the rectory. The suggested offering is \$10.
- † Bread and Wine: In the early Church it was customary for the People of God to provide the bread and wine to be used at the Celebration of the Eucharist. If you wish to participate in the ancient tradition of providing the bread and wine for the Celebration of the Eucharist in either the upper church or lower church as a memorial for your Family or your deceased loved ones, please call the rectory. Suggested offering: \$10.
- † Sanctuary Memorial Fund: This fund is an ideal way to memorialize deceased loved ones and friends. At the time of a funeral, funds can be directed to the Parish Sanctuary Fund. An acknowledgement of the gift is sent to the Family of the deceased. The fund is used for the upkeep of Saint Timothy Sanctuaries. Mass is offered for Memorial Fund Benefactors privately.

2020 Census

Census Takers in Your Neighborhood

Starting in July, census takers will visit homes that haven't yet responded to the 2020 Census. Census takers will wear a mask and follow local public health guidelines when they visit your home. All census takers complete virtual COVID-19 Training on social distancing and other health and safety protocols before beginning their work in neighborhoods.

Census takers are hired from your area, and their goal is to help you and everyone in your home be counted in the 2020 Census.. If the census taker who visits your home does not speak your language, you may request a return visit from a census taker who does speak your language.

If no one is home when the census taker visits, the census taker will leave a notice of their visit with information about how to [respond online, by phone or by mail.](#)

How Can You Verify That Someone Is A Census Taker

If someone visits your home this year to collect information for the 2020 Census, check to make sure they have a valid ID badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date. Census workers may also carry Census Bureau bags and other equipment with the Census Bureau logo



CHRISTIAN INITIATION

Christian Initiation of Adults is the process established for the universal Church for individuals to become Catholic and receive the sacraments of initiation—

Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist.

This is for persons in need of Baptism, persons baptized in another Christian tradition who desire to become Catholic and persons baptized Catholic in need of First Communion and Confirmation. The Rite speaks of conversion as a "spiritual journey." Centered on fostering a deep relationship with Jesus and the Church he founded, this journey takes place through distinct stages over a period of time.

The initial inquiry period at Saint Timothy begins in September. The first phase of the journey of initiation is a time for seekers to hear the mystery of Christ proclaimed. The inquirers consciously and freely seek the living God and enter the way of faith and conversion as the Holy Spirit opens their hearts.

Sisters of St. Joseph Invite You to Celebrate Laudato Si' Year

Pope Francis has announced that the period between May 24, 2020 and May 24, 2021 will be designated as Laudato Si' year for the Catholic Church. During this year of reflection the Sisters of St. Joseph will be providing excerpts each week from the encyclical along with reflection questions as one way for our parishioners to participate in this global commemoration.

July 12th: The urgent challenge to protect our common home includes a concern to bring the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development, for we know that things can change. The Creator does not abandon us; he never forsakes his loving plan or repents of having created us. Humanity still has the ability to work together in building our common home. Here I want to

recognize, encourage and thank all those striving in countless ways to guarantee the protection of the home which we share. Particular appreciation is owed to those who tirelessly seek to resolve the tragic effects of environmental degradation on the lives of the world's poorest. **Young people demand change.** They wonder how anyone can claim to be building a better future without thinking of the environmental crisis and the sufferings of the excluded.
