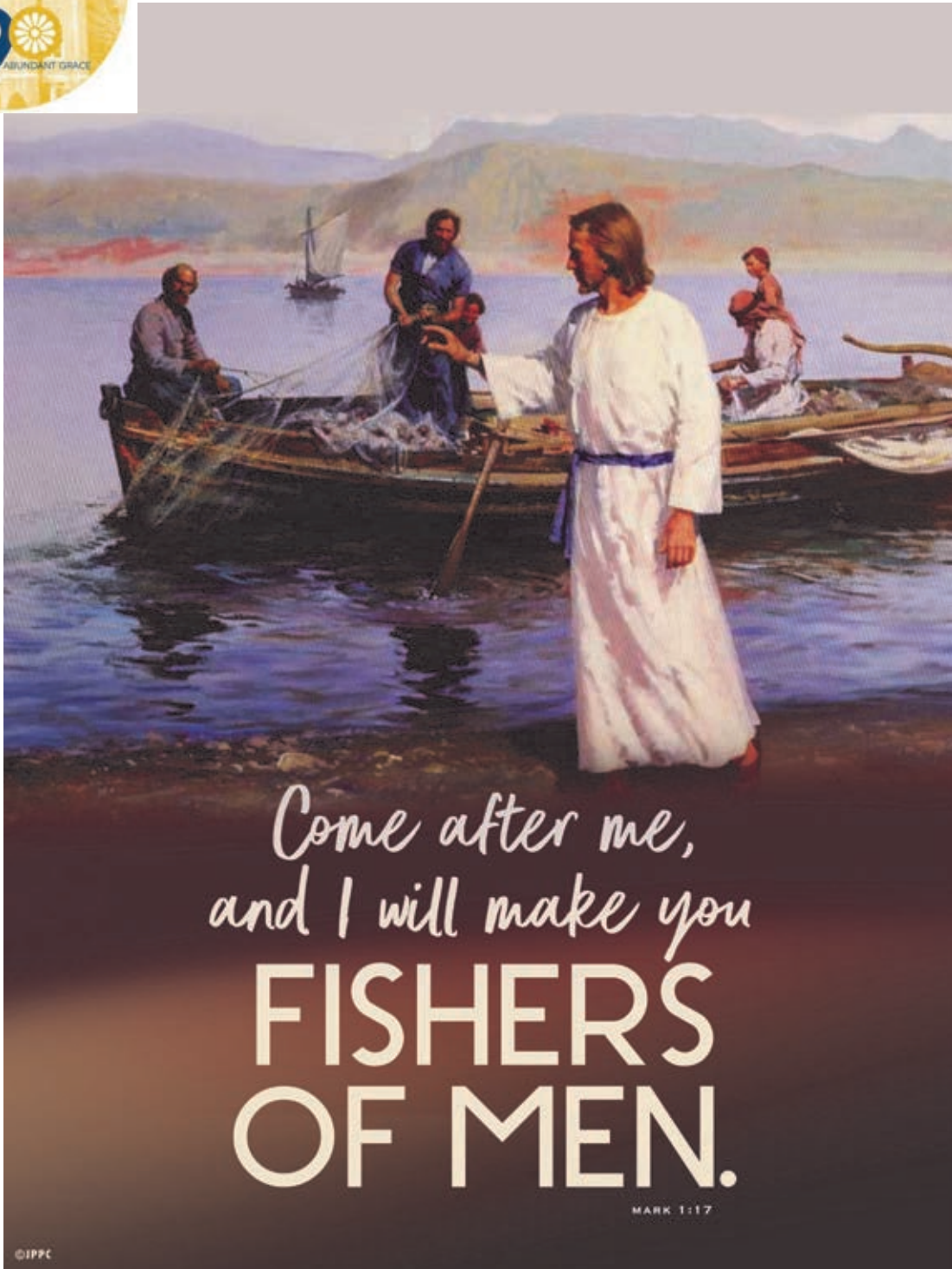

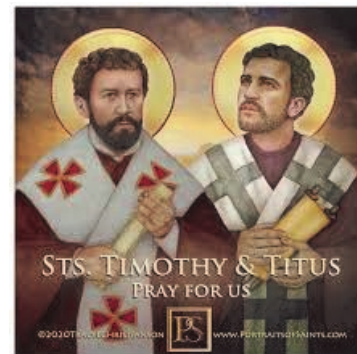
Feast of Saint Timothy Tuesday, January 26th

Please join us for
Solemn Mass
Celebrating Saint Timothy
at 8:30 am in the upper church.

St. Timothy (Patron saint of stomach and intestinal disorders.)

“...God gave us a spirit of love and of power,” wrote St. Paul in II Timothy 1:17.

This truth accompanying Timothy’s conversion to Christ in his late teens influenced him throughout his life. Growing up in the first century in Lystra, in today’s Central Turkey, Timothy’s father was a Greek and his mother a Jew. Greatly influenced by his mother and grandmother, he loved the Old Testament Scriptures. When he heard St. Paul preaching the Good News in 47 A.D., he was readily converted and went on to support and serve the Apostle, who was like a father to him. Timothy traveled extensively with St. Paul in Southern Europe and Asia Minor. He spent three years in Ephesus, the center for the worship of the goddess, Diana, beloved by the Ephesians who benefitted financially from this worship. The message of Paul and Timothy later proved to be a real threat to this worship. Timothy continued to help the Apostle Paul convert and nurture new Christians in their faith. A help to Paul during his first imprisonment in a house in Rome, Timothy was unable to support him during his later imprisonment in a Roman dungeon. It is from this dungeon, just before he was beheaded that the Apostle Paul wrote his last and encouraging letter to Timothy. This letter helped him over the next three decades faithfully care for the churches the two had established.



St. Titus (Patron saint of the United States Army Chaplain Corps.)

Titus, from a wealthy pagan family, received an excellent education in Hellenistic philosophy, ancient poets, and the sciences. As an affluent young man, Titus made the unusual choice to live a virtuous life. Not surprisingly, when he was twenty, he was warned in a dream to leave Hellenistic wisdom behind.

Consequently, he started studying the Old Testament and, in particular, the book of Isaiah, both of which prepared him to realize the importance of the Good News that Paul preached. When he heard about Jesus, he was converted and baptized. As a deeply committed Christian, Titus was proof of the power of the Gospel to the Gentiles. When he went with Paul and Barnabas to Jerusalem, this truth became more evident. Like Timothy, Titus also spent three years helping Paul build up the church in Ephesus. However, perhaps his greatest achievement was the reconciliation he achieved and solutions provided to problems in the Corinthian church. St. Titus remained faithful to preach the Gospel wherever he went.

Each of these men, different in temperament and background, was called by God when young. Each took risks and stepped out to follow Christ. They were aided by the Holy Spirit to achieve things they could never have done in their own strength. They listened attentively to the Apostle Paul and were instrumental in building and strengthening the first-century church. In 97 A.D., Timothy courageously took a strong stand against idol worship and consequently died a martyr, Titus also spoke against idol worship. When no one listened, he prayed so effectively that the statue of Diana fell and shattered, a miracle which attracted many to faith in Christ. St. Titus, a true soldier of Christ, died in his late nineties in 107 A.D.

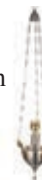

Prayers Wanted We have about 80 students preparing for sacraments in the Spring. Please take a prayer card and pray for a student. The cards are on the Upper Church altar rail and the tables on the sides of the sanctuary in the Lower Church. Praying for these students is a great way for our parish community to support the families of students in PREP and Blessed Trinity as they prepare for First Penance and Communion (Jan. 28th and May 8th respectively) and Confirmation (May 4th).

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES AS WE RETURN TO CHURCH

We remind you of our guidelines as we gather as a community of faith for Sunday Mass in light of the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Everyone is asked to wear a mask to church, that is, as you approach church, while you are in church, and when you leave church; obviously your mask will be removed when you come forward to receive Holy Communion;
- We ask everyone to sit only in the designated pews that are not roped-off;
- Please social distance from parishioners while entering and exiting the church;
- When in your pew, you may sit with your family members and/or the people with whom you live; if anyone else is in the same pew as you and your family, please social distance from them;
- Please try to keep a distance of six (6) feet from the person in front of you when coming forward to receive Holy Communion;
- The Communion procession will form and come forward as a single line (as opposed to the regular double line);
- The ushers will not be taking up the collection; I ask you to please place your church envelope/offering in one of the designated baskets (at the center of the church or at either end of the altar rail);
- Church bulletins are placed for your taking next to the collection baskets;
- Holy Water has been removed from the stoups for everyone's safety;
- It is strongly recommended that everyone receive Holy Communion in the hand for the time being;
- There are hand sanitizer dispensers located at all the entrances to the church, so that you may use them upon entering and exiting;
- The Church will be thoroughly sanitized after each Mass.

It is very important for everyone to remember that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still lifted in this Archdiocese for the time being; **therefore NO ONE is obligated to attend Mass even now that we are again open.** If you are not well or if you feel uncomfortable, please stay home! We will continue to record Mass and make it available on our Facebook page and on our website for the foreseeable future.

"Does Something Sound Different?"

You may have noticed our pipe organ sounds different. For the past two weeks extensive work was done on the reservoirs of the organ.

Our pipe organ is a living, breathing musical instrument of over 1600 pipes. You may remember that in 2019, the motor of "heart" of the organ was cleaned and parts replaced. This time, the reservoirs were repaired. The reservoirs are the "lungs" of the organ, where air is stored. They were being held together with duct tape. The reservoirs have been completely releathered and cleaned. This has resulted in the pipes speaking more clearly and improved the tuning.

These repairs were made possible by an organ grant from Partners for Sacred Places program for Saving and Activating Philadelphia's Historic Pipe Organs. The repairs were done by Peter Gerger of Jacob Gerger and Sons organ builders.

We are blessed at Saint Timothy that we have one of only two pipe organs left in the area. We are most grateful to the many parishioners, past and present, who through the years have supported this magnificent and unique which has allowed us to continually celebrate God's abundant grace to our parish.

Free home internet access for kinship caregivers of Philadelphia schoolchildren

PHLConnectED is a City program that provides free internet to Philadelphia K-12 caregivers who need reliable internet service in Philadelphia, including older adults who care for their grandchildren or other young relatives.

PHLConnectED offers two ways for free internet access to eligible caregivers:

****An in-home high-speed internet connection.**

****A high-speed mobile hotspot for families who are experiencing homelessness, in-between homes, housing insecure or where in-home connection is not possible.**

To prepare families for the new year with internet access to participate in remote learning, eligibility has been expanded to include Philadelphia K-12 families who have home internet access and meet one of the following criteria: participate in a public benefit program with income qualifications; have a child at home who is designated as an English Learner; or have a child at home who receives special education services.

The Aging Network and community organizations can help spread the word by using the City's communications toolkit, which includes a flyer, sample social media messaging, images and outreach materials. For info., call 2-1-1, (press 1 for English or press 8 for Spanish and translation services).

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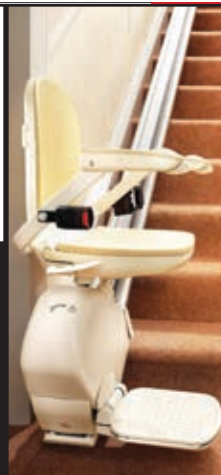


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
