- 2) What do you think the overall theme, or lesson, of <u>1984</u> is? Why do you think that? Do you think that theme is applicable today? Why or why not?
- 3) What is one aspect of the book that you enjoyed? Why?
- 4) What is one aspect of the book that you would change? Why?

For each of the following characters, choose a character trait that describes each one. Then, find a piece of evidence in the book (either a quote or an example) that demonstrates that quote. In the third box, explain why that evidence demonstrates your character trait.
