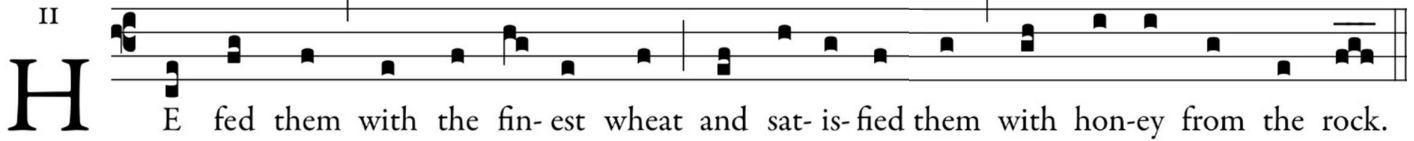

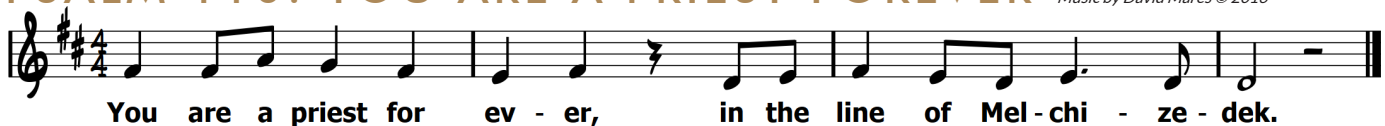

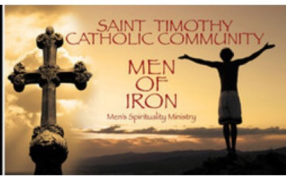

## Corpus Christi Sunday - Q&A - The Feast of the Body & Blood of Christ

**Q:** How did the feast of Corpus Christi come to be?

**A:** In the 13th century, St. Julianna of Cornillon had a vision of the moon with a darkened spot. She heard a voice compare the moon to the Church and lament that the dark spot was a missing feast day to honor the Blessed Sacrament. At first, this feast was only celebrated locally in her home diocese in Belgium. Several years later in Orvieto, Italy, a Eucharistic miracle took place where the Host bled at the moment of consecration. The bishop of Orvieto took this host to Pope Urban IV (who was from St. Julianna's home and had been the one to affirm her vision of the moon). Pope Urban IV also saw the bleeding Host as a miracle. In 1264, he issued an official declaration to establish the feast of Corpus Christi. Countries throughout the world have developed many of their own traditions surrounding the celebration of the feast day ever since.

**Q:** Are there still Eucharistic miracles today?

**A:** According to Our Sunday Visitor, more than 100 Eucharistic miracles have been recognized by the Church in some way. Today, reported Eucharistic miracles are carefully tested and examined to ensure validity. In some of these miracles, the Host has transformed into human flesh or blood. Testing in these situations has revealed that the blood type in every case is type AB, the sample comes from the heart (often a piece of heart muscle), and signs of distress are left behind, as if the person had endured something physically traumatic. In some places, such as Orvieto, the faithful can still see and pray before these miraculous Hosts.

**Q:** What saints are known for their Eucharistic devotion?

**A:** While every saint recognized the true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, some have become more known for their Eucharistic devotion. St. Clare of Assisi is often depicted carrying a monstrance because of a time when she rose from her sickbed during an attack to carry the Eucharistic Jesus to the doors of her convent. The attacking army immediately fled in retreat. St. Julian Peter Emyard had such a profound experience of Christ when celebrating Corpus Christi that he devoted his life to preaching about love of God and the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. Blessed Carlos Acutis, the first millennial on his way to sainthood loved the Eucharistic Jesus so fiercely that he created a website cataloging Eucharistic miracles.
