





The **STATIONS OF THE CROSS** is a popular devotion consisting of appropriate meditations before each of 14 Stations representing successive stages in the Passion of Our Lord. The Way of the Cross is the most heavily indulgenced devotion in the Catholic Church; it is a devotion reputed to have been originated by Our Lady herself, who, legend has it, set up the original Way of the Cross in Her backyard in Ephesus. Moreover, the great saints all affirm that meditation on the Passion and Death of Our Lord and Savior is the most fruitful devotion in which one can engage.

DO YOU FEEL YOU ARE CALLED TO ASSIST IN A WORSHIP MINISTRY?

We are looking to expand the number of **Lectors** and **Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion** available for weekend Masses. If you have ever considered becoming a Lector or EMHC, we welcome you to call the parish office (815)459-3033 and let us know. We will get your contact information and follow up with you when we have a training session scheduled.

Lectors are adults and youth who proclaim God's Word at our Masses. Two lectors are scheduled for each Mass and they proclaim the Scripture readings, and assist by reading the Prayers of the Faithful when a Deacon is not present. They are expected to prepare extensively to proclaim well. Auditions and training are required.

The 'Ordinary Ministers of the Eucharist' are the ordained bishop and priest, and the 'Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion' is the ordained Deacon. 'Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion' are lay people who assist the clergy in the distribution of Holy Communion at weekend Masses and special liturgies. There is an initial training session, and you must attend any additional training sessions or meetings when required. Also, there is the expectation of strengthening the EMHC's relationship with our Eucharistic Lord through attendance at weekly Adoration.

Both Lector's and EMHC's must be at least 16 years old; have received Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation; and be a Catholic in good standing with the Church (single, in a valid Catholic marriage, divorced and not remarried outside the Church or widowed).

DIOCESE OF ROCKFORD INVEST IN KIDS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The SGOs then provide scholarships for students whose families meet the income requirements to attend qualified, non-public schools in Illinois. TAKING CARE OF THE TEMPLE

"Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" 1COR 3:16

April is designated as **Alcohol Awareness Month** by the Office of Disease Prevention and Health Promotion. There has been much publicity in the news about Opioid addiction; however, alcohol is *legal* and the effects of this substance abuse can be *devastating* to individuals, families and communities. The effects of alcohol abuse are cumulative, significantly contributing to costly social, physical, mental and public health problems. If you think that you may have a problem with alcohol, small changes can make a big difference in reducing your chances of having real alcohol-related problems. Here are some strategies to try:

- •Keep track of how much you drink. Enter notes in your mobile phone. Carry a drink tracker in your wallet.
- •Count and measure. Know the standard drink sizes and how much alcohol is contained in a mixed drink, beer or wine.
- •Set goals. Decide how many days a week you want to drink and how many per day.
- Find alternatives. If drinking has occupied a lot of your time, fill free time with healthy activities, hobbies or relationships.
- •Avoid triggers. What triggers your urge to drink? Once identified, try and avoid them. For example, drinking at home? Keep little or no alcohol there.
- •Have a plan to handle urges. Talk to someone you trust or engage in an activity that doesn't involve drinking, for example, exercising or going for a walk
- example, exercising or going for a walk.

 •Prepare your "no". When offered a drink in a social setting, have a polite and convincing "no thank you" ready.
