"Rejoice: the Lord is nigh." As Christmas draws near, the Church emphasizes the joy which should be in our hearts over all that the birth notes of our Savior means for us.

The great joy of Christians is

to see the day drawing nigh when the Lord will come again in His glory to lead them into His kingdom. The oft-repeated Veni ("Come") of Advent is an echo not only of the prophets, but also of the conclusion of the Apocalypse of St. John: "Come, Lord Jesus," the last words of the New Testament.

Today is known as Gaudete Sunday. The term Gaudete refers to the first word of the Entrance Antiphon, "Rejoice". Rose vestments are worn to emphasize our joy that Christmas is near, and we also light the rose candle on our Advent wreath.

Advent is the season of preparing for the arrival of the Lord Jesus (both his first coming and his second coming), and by the third Sunday of Advent, we are most of the way through the season. Thus it is appropriate to rejoice as we see the goal of the season approaching: "The Lord is near."

As Christmas fast approaches I have begun praying hard for all of those that will visit our church and attend Mass on the 24th or the 25th whom have not stepped in our parish doors since Easter or maybe even last Christmas. "Christers" is the name they are given. This word is a blending of Christmas and Easter signifying that this is the only time we will see them attending Mass. Is there anything we can do to try to help them find their way back home more regularly? Yep. Three things. 1) Pray for them. That they begin to see what we see; the glory of our Catholic faith and the graces that flow from practicing it every day! 2) We are putting together a Christmas card/flyer with some events in the parish in 2020 that might interest them...Irish Fest, Fish Fry, etc. A card that might just perhaps appeal to people who are really more "secular" in their views at this point in their journey. I know it can be frustrating to come to Christmas Mass early to be sure you get seats in the exact pew you like to sit in...and then at the last minute, in come a few people you have never seen before...and they want to sit in your row and they want you to move in! Yep. We have all been there. This year move in with joy! Welcome them. Even just a hello and a smile go a long way. It is one Mass and you will receive many graces for doing this! A small experience like this can determine whether or not these Christers feel loved and welcomed and can go a long way in how they feel as they walk out of the church that day- and this in turn can have a huge impact on how soon they come back. According to the National Fire Protection
Association, December & January are the peak months for home fires to occur. The following are some tips to keep you & yours safe while enjoying the holidays:



#### Candles:

- Always keep an eye on candles and extinguish them when you leave the room.
- Keep candles away from flammable objects, such as gift boxes, curtains, etc. and out of reach of children.
- Always use sturdy metal, glass or ceramic candleholders
   Kitchen: The leading area in the home where fires start.
   Never leave the range, broiler or oven unattended.
   Keep a fire extinguisher handy and know how to use it.

#### Fireplaces:

- Place a sturdy screen in front of the fireplace.
- Before you start a fire, make sure the flue is clear and not blocked.
- When was the last time you had a Chimney Sweep?
- Do not put any gift-wrap, boxes or pine needles in the fire
- Keep a fire extinguisher handy here, too.

#### **Christmas Trees:**

- Make sure the lights are UL certified and there are no exposed wires in the extension cords.
- Unplug ALL lights before retiring for the night.
- If you have a real Christmas tree, make sure it stays well hydrated.

Our babies are just over 1- 1/2 inches long now, about the size of a fig and are now almost fully formed. Her hands will soon open and close into fists. Tiny tooth buds are beginning to appear under her gums, and some of her bones are beginning to harden. Requirements for Baptism

In order to have your child baptized at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the following is required:

- To be a registered member of our parish.
- Attend a Baptismal Preparation class (call the Parish Office to register for this class in advance as space is limited). For your convenience, you may attend the class before your child is born.
- Schedule the Baptism- the 1st and 3rd Sunday of the month following the 11:15AM Mass (12:30PM Baptismal Service).
