

### **Learning and Living Our Catholic Faith**

### **BAPTISM: COMMUNION WITH THE SAINTS IS UNIVERSAL**

Today we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, and close the Christmas season. Tomorrow, Ordinary Time begins. In Baptism, all human persons are adopted into God's family and given new life by water and the Holy Spirit. This can be easy to say, but our experience can sometimes challenge us to recognize its truth in all people. Sometimes we see other cultural traditions as being more foreign to what we recognize as a life of faith based on our own culture. The challenge is to accept that God has reached out to people of every cultural background to proclaim His Good News, and they have each grasped it differently, with different musical expressions, different rhythms of life, and different customs, which are all equally capable of finding their place in God's family, and in the Communion of the Saints.

A Catholic who is being considered for this recognition is first proclaimed Servant of God, then Venerable, then Blessed, and finally, Saint. We have, right here in our diocese, a candidate for universal recognition as a saint (by a process called "canonization"): Venerable Father Augustus Tolton. Venerable Tolton lived from 1854 to 1897 and became the first African American priest, in a time in which churchmen found it difficult to recognize his vocation. At this time, he is one of six African American Catholics whose causes for sainthood are open.

In November, three more causes for sainthood were introduced for American laypeople: Auguste Pelafiue, Charlene Richard, and Joseph Dutton. And, don't forget that the founder of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary is also Venerable, on the way to recognition as a saint (brunolanteri.org).

Pray for their intercession and assistance along your own journey of faith. If you receive a miracle or an answered prayer, contact the organization sponsoring that person's cause for canonization to share your good news. Together, may we attain the holiness God desires from each of us

### TRAVELING MARY IS BACK!!

### What is it??

The traveling Mary, Our Lady of Grace statue is a tool to encourage families to come together to pray for

vocations and to encourage young people to be open to the priesthood or religious life. The aim of the traveling Mary statue is to help the parish families become more aware of the need for vocations and of the possibility that God may be calling a member of their family to serve the Church in this way. Vocations become a normal conversation topic in the household, and individuals are able to learn more about the beauty of vocations.



### **How it Works**

Families sign up to host Mary, Our Lady of Grace statue for one week (Sunday - Friday), gathering around the statue daily and using the Lanterian Prayer booklet to pray for vocations along with any other prayers of their choosing. The family will be invited forward to pick up the statue after the announcements, just before the final blessing. They will then return the statue to the parish office on the following wFriday so it can be passed along to another family within the Sunday masses. If the parish office is closed, please drop the statue off at the rectory.


