My spiritual director posed this question, is it harder to love God or to be loved by God? At the time, I said it's harder to love God because of all the effort it takes to be holy, prayerful, virtuous, and focused. As the years have gone by, I now think it's harder to be loved by God. To let God love me demands surrender, docility, and humility. It also means that I am challenged to see myself as loveable.

One thing I have learned in ministry is that many people do not really love themselves or even like who they see in the mirror. On some levels this fact makes sense. No one knows us as we know ourselves; no one else sees all of our temptations, bad thoughts, sins, and messiness as we do. To live with oneself one's whole life is at times a tremendous burden.

The joyful news of our faith is that God finds us loveable! Christ always comes in pursuit of us. As Fr. Shawn Monahan likes to say "God loves you and there's nothing you can do about it!" By virtue of our life in Christ, baptized as beloved children of the Father, we all have the same journey to make, the path of self-surrender whereby we open ourselves in freedom and humility to the transforming love of God. The first step, to which we must return again and again, is allowing God to love us, letting Him break through our walls of shame, guilt, and self-loathing. This spiritual breakthrough frees us to love parents, children, spouses, family, parishioners, and strangers without conditions, limits, or expectation. You are deeply loved by God!

This is what we will be able to celebrate in its fullness in heaven - how God redeemed each and every moment of our life to make it fruitful by His grace and resplendent with His glory.

In the Gospel, Jesus prays that believers will be one, united to him and the Father.

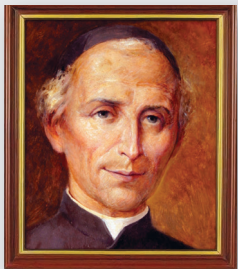

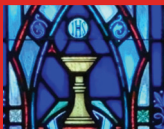

THRIVE BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN

The annual BABY BOTTLE CAMPAIGN for ThriVe MetroEast has begun!! ThriVe MetroEast is a Pro-Life Medical Pregnancy Clinic that aims to be the first choice for women facing an unplanned pregnancy. Their services include:

- medical services related to pregnancy and sexual health
- information, counseling and support to individuals facing an unplanned pregnancy or coping with a past abortion or pregnancy loss
- equipping services to individuals and organizations

The majority of their clients are single between the ages of 20-29. The number of abortion-determined women whom they serve, from 43 different ZIP Codes, has quadrupled in the last 2 years. ThriVe MetroEast's goal is for these women to make ThriVe their first choice before going to an abortion clinic. It costs on average \$1,200 to save one life from abortion. Through the Baby Bottle Campaign, we can help ThriVe help these women and their babies. **The Campaign runs from Mother's Day through Father's Day.**
