

Learning and Living Our Catholic Faith

"Nunc Coepimus. We Begin Again." (2.0!)

As parishioners of St. Mary's, you have undoubtedly heard an Oblate Priest quote the words of our Founder, Venerable Bruno Lanteri, "Nunc Coepi - I Begin Again." As a spiritual son of Fr. Lanteri, I propose an alternative to his simple, yet powerful quote: "Nunc Ceopimus - We Begin Again."

This summer, I will Begin Again as I have been named Vocation Director for the Oblates of the Virgin Mary in the United States. With this new position comes a new move. I will be returning to live in Oblate house of formation at St. Clement's in Boston. However, my appointment as Vocation Director is ultimately a new beginning for both the Oblates and St. Mary's, hence *Nunc Coepimus, We Begin Again*. It's a new beginning for all of us because I now see how small, and limited, and unworthy, I am of this role. I recognize how much assistance I need from both the Holy Spirit and the laity, especially the parishioners of St. Mary's. I need your prayers!

To be honest, I am not good with saying, "Goodbye." You can take the man out of Jerseyville, but not the Jerseyville out of the man. The past two years have been a tremendous blessing. I have been able to live part of my infancy as a Priest literally in "my own backyard." Yet, I have also known for quite some time that Holy Spirit has been leading me towards this new path. Christ has placed a desire in my heart to accompany young men, one-on-one, and help them to echo our Blessed Mother's joyful "Yes" to both the Priesthood and the Oblates of the Virgin Mary and this desire has become aflame.

With this news, some have already asked and more will ask, "What do you need?" As previously written, I need your prayers. Specifically, I invite all of you to pray daily these words:

O Glorious St. Joseph, model of masculinity and purity, you were the head of the holy household in Nazareth. You are also the special patron of the Oblates of the Virgin Mary. We now entrust to you the Oblates future and their desire to grow in vocations and to expand their mission for the sanctification of their members and the salvation of souls. Through your powerful intercession, make them faithful, wise, and courageous sons of Mary. Amen.

5TH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 6:1-7 ~ 1 Peter 2:4-9 ~ John 14:1-12

Focus: Let us truly be the body of Christ by demonstrating the Father's love to others.

How can we walk alongside the way and the truth and the life? We can be Christ to each other. As the body of Christ, we do His works. We offer our time, talent, or treasure to those in need. Let us ask Jesus how we can continue to build His kingdom on earth.

In the Acts of the Apostles, the new role of deacon fills practical needs of the growing Church. The first Epistle of Peter calls us to be built together as living stones, into a spiritual house. We are a royal priesthood called into the light of Christ. In the Gospel, Jesus reassures His disciples that He goes to prepare a place for them. He promises that those who believe in Him will do His works and greater ones.

327. MAY ROSARY – Pray with us!



This dynamic experience will include nationally recognized Catholic speakers, adoration, confession, and Mass. The arena will be packed with thousands of Catholics from across the diocese. To attend, contact the parish office as each parish in the diocese is given a specific number of available seats. Visit the Cathedral in Springfield or Ss. Peter and Paul Church in Alton, receive an indulgence! - The diocesan-wide Year of the Eucharist going on now has a heavenly treasure of our Catholic faith attached to it. Bishop Thomas John Paprocki received permission from the Holy See, granting a plenary indulgence to those who make a pilgrimage to the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception in Springfield or Ss. Peter and Paul Church in Alton (the "Old Cathedral") now through Dec. 8. One must also partake in the other usual conditions to receive this indulgence by going to Confession, receiving the Eucharist, and saying prayers for the intention of the Pope. These acts "may be carried out several days preceding or following the performance of the prescribed works. But it is more fitting that communion and the prayer for the pope's intentions take place on the day the work is performed" (Handbook of Indulgences, Norms for Indulgences, 23.3). An indulgence a gift and grace that remits the temporal punishment due to a sin.
