

Learning and Living Our Catholic Faith

Dear all:

I wish you all a blessed *Corpus Christi* --- Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ in this Diocesan Year of the Eucharist. We waited for this weekend to inform everyone about a few changes in the way Holy Communion will happen at Masses. These changes involve Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC), but everyone will notice these subtle and not so subtle changes.

The following changes will be made effective June 10th:

- 1) The 11:00am Sunday Mass will now include the option of receiving the chalice with the Precious Blood of Christ. EMHC's will be scheduled and assigned to take up this service.
- 2) At Holy Communion time for all Masses, EMHC's will now gather at the base of the altar steps during the Lamb of God (spoken or sung) and will proceed inside the sacristy until the celebrating priest has received both the Body and Precious Blood of Christ, at which time they will assemble near the ambo to receive the Eucharist and their duties.
- 3) The 8:00am daily Mass (Monday through Saturday) will also include the option to receive the Precious Blood from the Chalice. Br. Miggo will assist at these Masses with the exception of Wednesday Mass, at which time an EMHC will be needed.

These changes are intended to foster order and reverence; and even greater opportunities to receive our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Finally, a few reminders on reverently receiving the Eucharist...taken from the USCCB document, *On Reception of Holy Communion at Mass*.

...the fact that the Communion Procession is a profoundly religious action tells us something about the way in which we should participate in this procession. We are the Body of Christ, moving forward to receive the Christ who makes us one with himself and with one another. Our procession should move with dignity; our bearing should be that of those who know they have been redeemed by Christ and are coming to receive their God!

The General Instruction asks each country's Conference of Bishops to determine the posture to be used for the reception of Communion and the act of reverence to be made by each person as he or she receives Communion. In the United States, the body of Bishops has determined that "[t]he norm... is that Holy Communion is to be received standing, unless an individual member of the faithful wishes to receive Communion while kneeling" and that a bow is the act of reverence made by those receiving...

Those who receive Communion may receive in the hand or on the tongue, and the decision should be that of the individual receiving, not of the person distributing Communion. If Communion is received in the hand, the hands should first of all be clean. If one is right handed the left hand should rest upon the right. The host will then be laid in the palm of the left hand and then taken by the right hand to the mouth. If one is left-handed this is reversed. It is not appropriate to reach out with the fingers and take the host from the person distributing.

When one receives from the chalice, the same proclamation is made by the person distributing Communion and the Communicant again responds, "Amen." It should be noted that it is never permissible for a person to dip the host he or she has received into the chalice. If, for some reason, the communicant is not able or willing to drink from the cup then that person should receive only under the form of bread.

SOLEMNITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI

Deuteronomy 8:2-3 ~ 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 ~ John 6:51-58

Focus: Are we living our lives on earth as if we are destined for Heaven?

When we consume the Body and Blood of the Lord, do we let our Lord consume us? If we are in Christ and He is in us, how does it change us? Let the Living Bread we eat today transform and strengthen us to do Christ's work on earth.

In the first reading, Moses reminds the people that God fed them with manna to show them that one does not live by bread alone. In the second reading, Saint Paul beautifully describes the bread and the cup as a participation in Christ, making us one body. In the Gospel, Jesus declares Himself the living bread, promising life to those who eat His flesh and drink His blood.


