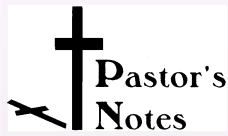

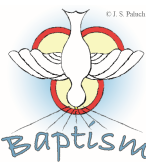

Meals, laundry and housekeeping are included in the rent. The rent is subsidized, based on income, assets and medical expenses. Private pay, long-term care insurance, and Medicaid are accepted for the Nursing Area.

The mission of the Little Sisters of the Poor is to welcome the needy elderly of any faith into their Home as they would Jesus Christ himself, and serve them with love and respect until death. 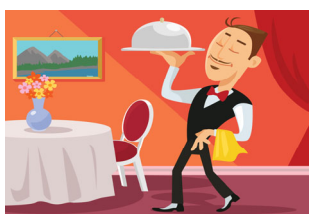
