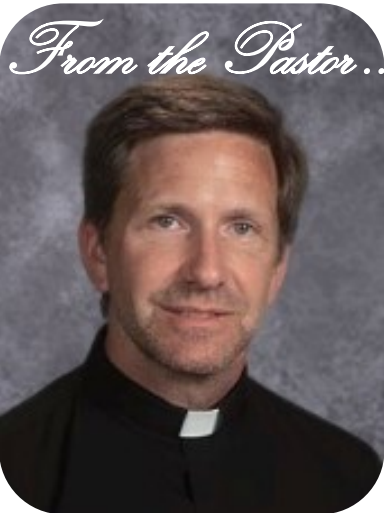

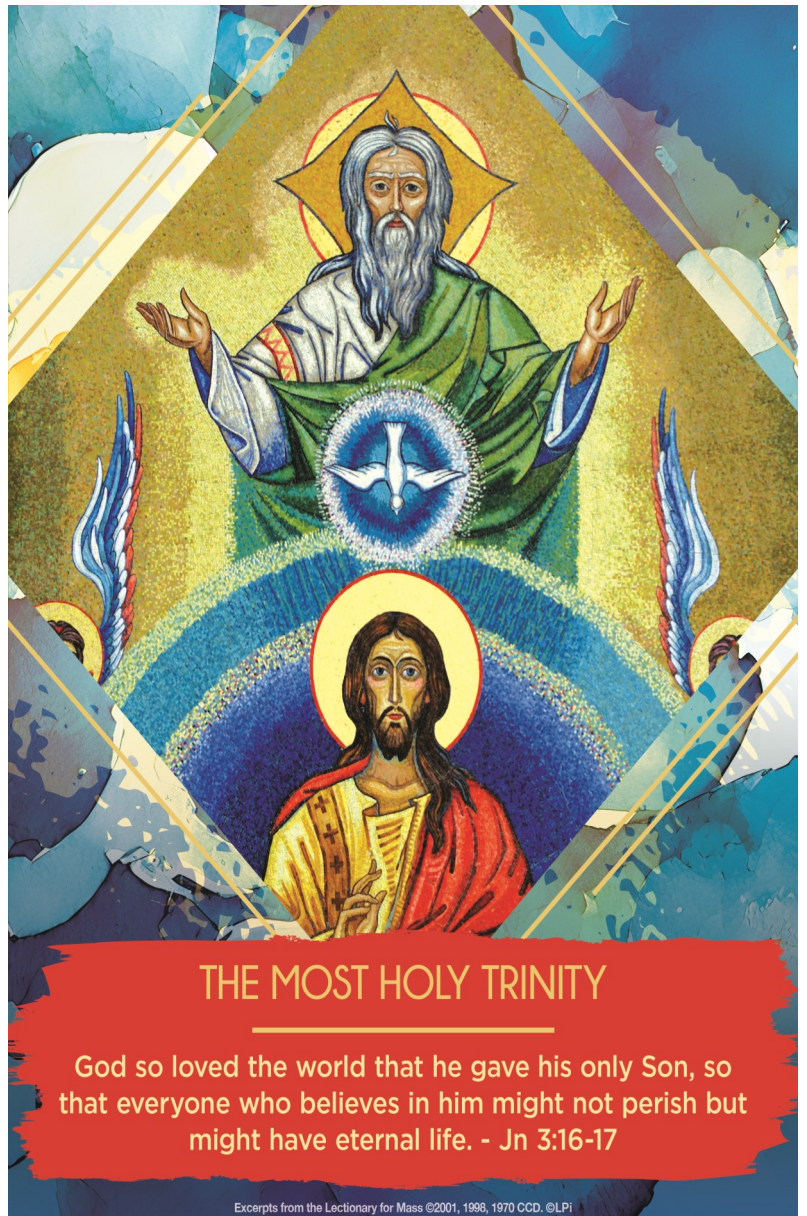

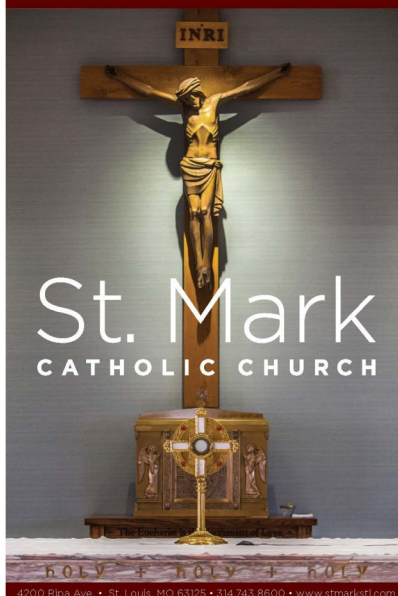

Solemnity of Pentecost 2023

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

This weekend the Church throughout the world celebrates the Solemnity of Pentecost, and so commemorates the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles, the foundation of the Church, and the beginning of her mission to all nations and peoples.

The mystery of Pentecost exhorts us to prayer and commitment to mission. The Holy Spirit inspires faith, hope, and charity in the hearts of the faithful, and ennobles the numerous and varied ways of transmitting the Christian message according to the culture and customs of all times and places. While giving us access to communion with God in prayer, the Holy Spirit also prompts us towards service of our neighbor by encountering him, by reconciliation, by witness, by a desire for justice and peace, by renewal of outlook, by social progress, and missionary commitment.

Almost two years ago, we as an Archdiocese embarked upon a strategic pastoral planning process, *All Things New*. We prayed to the Holy Spirit for guidance, and we committed ourselves to you, the faithful of this Archdiocese. An extensive process of listening was undertaken in all the parishes. Thereafter, I consulted the Archdiocesan Presbyteral Council regarding every parish under consideration. I then spent time in further prayer, study, and discernment, after which I reached the following decision regarding St. Mark parish.

Your parish will subsume St. Andrew parish, St. Bernadette parish, St. Martin of Tours parish, and St. Matthias parish, effective August 1, 2023. The reason that forms the basis of my decision will be outlined in the decree concerning your parish and will be published at allthingsnew.archstl.org by Sunday afternoon, May 28. Any member of your parish who claims to have been aggrieved by this Decree has the right to ask me to change my decision. This request must be made in writing and postmarked no later than June 12, 2023, to me at the Cardinal Rigali Center.

In order to best provide for the needs of our local Church, I have decided to appoint your pastor, the Reverend Brian Hecktor, as pastor of St. Justin Martyr parish in Sunset Hills, effective August 1. I invite you to express your gratitude to your pastor for his dedicated service in your parish.

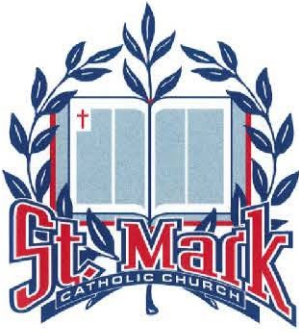
Your new pastor will be the Reverend Robert Burkemper. Your new senior associate pastor will be the Reverend Richard Schilli and your new associate pastor will be the newly ordained, Reverend C. Alan Boedeker. Please warmly welcome them, as well as the new members of your parish family.

Join me in praying for those among the faithful of the Archdiocese who will also be hearing challenging news this weekend regarding their parish.

May the Holy Spirit draw us all closer together as we rededicate ourselves to new modes of evangelization and social outreach in bearing witness to our faith in Jesus.

Dear St. Mark Parishioners,

After the All Things New announcements last weekend, I know you have many questions, and they will get resolved in time. Please see the letter from the Archbishop on the opposite side of this sheet (this was read last weekend at Mass), and see the decrees and other information at allthingsnew.archstl.org.

Here's what I know so far: The other four Lemay Parishes are being "subsumed" into St. Mark Parish. This means that on the effective date of August 1, those parishes will all become St. Mark Parish. According to the St. Louis Review, subsume means,

"One (or more) parishes are united to another parish in such a way that the first parish no longer exists and the second remains. This type of modification occurs where the parish(es) being subsumed are significantly smaller in numbers of parishioners than the remaining parish. The parish church is the church of the remaining parish; Masses are celebrated at the parish church while the other church(es) remain open to the faithful."

This means St. Mark will be expanding to include the territory of St. Andrew, St. Martin of Tours, St. Bernadette, and St. Matthias. However, as stated above, for the time being, those four churches will remain open for the faithful. Perhaps Masses will be offered there as well. The ultimate fate of those churches and grounds will not be immediately decided.

Our church will be the main church of worship. That means we must be welcoming to new parishioners and be considerate of what they may be experiencing. We must also be flexible to changes here, such as perhaps changes to Mass times or other events. Twenty years ago, many of you went through a similar process, so I have no doubt you will empathize with those who may be grieving and upset. But we are a hopeful people who know Christ is still with us and invites us to new life. We know Christ is really, truly, and substantially present in the Eucharist wherever we worship.

While I am sad to leave in August, I know you will welcome your new pastor, Fr. Robert Burkemper, your new Senior Associate Pastor Fr. Richard Schilli, and your new Associate Pastor, Fr. C. Alan Boedeker.

We may experience changes in staff as the other parishes join ours. After August 1, Fr. Burkemper will begin the process of staff re-alignment. He will work together with the Office of Human Resources for the Archdiocese and will be meeting with Parish and Finance Councils to better understand the needs of the parish. This process will last approximately through October. More details will be coming. In the meantime, we continue to pray for the successful implementation of All Things New and that we continue to faithfully follow Christ.
