


MEET THE SISTERS OF THE SALESIAN MISSIONARIES OF MARY IMMACULATE

Many members of our enlarged Catholic community in Lemay may already have seen or met the four Indian Sisters who dwell in the convent at St. Matthias.

They are members of an Apostolic Religious Institute of Pontifical Right within the Salesian Society (the various religious congregations who take inspiration from St Francis De Sales).

This little community began its work in St. Louis in 2008 sponsored by Catholic Charities as pastoral care ministers among the area's homeless population.

Since 2013 they have engaged in a variety of ministries with the sick and homebound.



Sister Jolly Joseph, the local superior of the house, is a microbiologist, who serves at St. Joseph Hospital in St. Charles.



Sister Elsy Joyce has long worked with those who are homebound or living in senior living centers around St. Matthias.



Sister Mareena Joseph is currently working at St. Agnes Home in Kirkwood as an Assistant Director of Nursing.



Sister Shiny Francis, the most recent arrival to the Sisters' St. Louis Mission is studying for her Licensure in Nursing.
