


### ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

The St. Vincent de Paul Society is "a Catholic lay organization, leading women and men to join together to grow spiritually by offering person-to-person service to the needy and suffering." It is made up of people who take the teaching of Jesus seriously: "Whatever you do for the least of My people, you do for Me." Under the umbrella of the local St. Louis St. Vincent de Paul Council, the conferences that have been active in the various parish sites that now make up our St. Mark Parish are staffed by our fellow parishioners who have a special charism/gift of serving the poor among us.

The Society takes its name from St. Vincent de Paul, a priest in 16<sup>th</sup> century France, who was known for his ministry to poor galley slaves, widows and children. Together with wealthy women of Paris, such as St. Louise de Marillac, he founded the lay-led Ladies of Charity and the Daughters of Charity of Saint Vincent de Paul, a society of apostolic life for women. He also founded what is now known as the Congregation of the Mission, or the "Vincentians" or "Lazarists," a community of priests and brothers who devote themselves to the service of the poor and the education of men for the priesthood.

Blessed Frederic Ozanam actually established the first Society of Saint Vincent de Paul in 1833 with a group of French university students who were dedicated to the service of the poor. Their mission was to work with the poor, providing immediate aid of food, clothing and shelter whenever and wherever possible. Our own St. Louis is the location of its first establishment in the United States, as commemorated by a plaque on the outside wall of the Old Catholic downtown.

Our fellow parishioner Society members meet on a regular basis to help our local neighbors-in-need (nin). There is no discrimination by nationality, religion or orientation of any kind. All work is done in confidence to keep anonymous our nin. We help people as we are able, not because they are Catholic, but because we are Catholic. Funds for such help come from free-will donations through parish site collections and various poor boxes, and food is collected likewise through the generosity of parishioners for our food banks.

As our five parish sites are being united, so too are the St. Vincent de Paul Conferences. And, although the Society's conferences are not parish-based as such, they tend to try to serve the poor who are in the site boundaries. We encourage the various conference members who have been working with the poor in their particular parish sites to continue their service there because they have come to know best who the people are and what are their needs.

# THIRD QUARTER 2023 RESULTS FOR ST. MARK SVDP CONFERENCE

Since the 5 Lemay SVdP Conferences are not joined yet, this Third Quarter Report represents only the results of St. Mark St. Vincent de Paul.

St. Mark parishioner donations to St. Vincent de Paul in July, August and September 2023 were \$10,511.
