#### THE PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

#### How long since your last confession?

#### Remember how to make a good confession?

#### 1) Make a Good Examination of Conscience.

Ask God's help to remember the poor choices by which you may have failed to do the good Christ calls each of us to strive for each day.

Some common questions that may give insight into what you might confess are:

#### Where have I knowingly fallen short of the honor and love which I owe to God?

In my failure to honor the Lord by active participation in the Holy Mass each Sunday?

In my neglect of making prayer a part of my life each and every day?

In my careless use of God's Name as a curse?

#### Where have I failed to show respect and love for others that Christ commands?

In speaking in hurtful, critical or abusive ways to my family members and others with whom I have daily contact?

In my abuse of food, drink, or drugs?

In my viewing of pornography or engaging in any sexual act outside marriage, alone or with others?

In my lying to others or cheating them out of what is rightfully theirs?

In my lashing out in anger or doing violence to another in any way.

#### 2) Confess your sins and receive a penance.

The goal of confession is not just to obtain forgiveness but to make some change for the better in your life, so Father will ask you to perform some form of penance (some act of prayer or charity).

#### 3) Make an Act of Contrition.

This may be a spontaneous or memorized prayer of sorrow for these sins and a request for help to do better.

### 4) Listen to the Words of Absolution and go in peace to love the Lord and all those around you.

A Confessor is present one hour before each of the weekend Masses during Lent and Wednesday evenings after the 6:30 PM Mass at St. Mark.

Three Confessors will be present at St. Martin's on March 26<sup>th</sup> from 7:00 PM until all who desire to receive Reconciliation are heard.




# 40 CANS FOR LENT
