For two weeks these students, cleaned, painted, worked with small groups and did anything and everything asked of them.

Our younger students could not believe some of these kids actually went to this school AND were taught by the teachers here. We are proud of the wonderful young men and women our graduates have become and we are grateful for everything they did for us during their weeks of service.



Catapult Grant

In November we submitted a grant to the Innovative Technology Education Fund ITEF). This grant gives educators the opportunity to innovate their teaching and student learning, with new technology and equipment. St. Mark was awarded \$13,000. We used these funds to purchase 45 new tablets for the primary classrooms and three new view boards for the third and fifth grade classrooms and the science lab. Thank you ITEF!

Herb Society of America Grant

In addition to the Catapult Grant, St. Mark was awarded a \$300 grant from the Herb Society of America. The funds will be used to purchase an indoor hydroponic garden, an outdoor herb garden tower and seeds. Students will tend to the gardens and record their observations as the garden grows.

Veteran's Day

This year, St. Mark was able to continue our tradition of honoring our Veterans.

The event began with a mass followed by a ceremony in the gym. An Honor Guard presented the colors and a short musical program followed. A light breakfast and beverages were provided and each veteran was given a packet with a prayer and a soldier.
