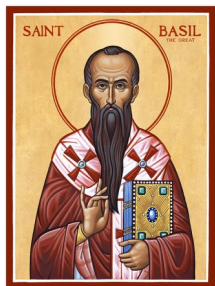

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The Sacred Heart has one of the deepest meanings in the Roman Catholic practice. The symbol represents Jesus Christ's actual heart as His love for all of humanity. The Sacred Heart can be depicted a few different ways. The most common depiction is the heart with a circle of thorns that represent the crown of thorns that was placed on Jesus' head. It also may have a cross, which represents the Crucifixion. Other symbols may have a flame or light surrounding it, which signifies the divine light of love.
