Oooh! Halloween! All Hallows Eve it is! "Hallows" is an old-fashioned word for saints, so the name of this secular holiday actually has Christian origins. Ghouls and skeletons and Disney characters notwithstanding, it is the eve of All Saints Day, November 1, when we celebrate all the saints of heaven. Not just the canonized saints recognized by the whole Church as being with God in Heaven, but ANYONE who has lived their life in such a way as to be welcomed into the heavenly realm. Though, as I explained last week that because All Saints Day falls on Monday this year we are not obliged to attend Mass, we still celebrate all of our brother and sister human beings who have made it to Heaven.

"Movie Night" began this past week at St. Basil. Deacon John has organized this for 5:30 on Wednesday nights. He will be showing episodes of "The Chosen," which is a really high quality retelling of the gospel story in a series of TV episodes. Normally, in Jesus movies, they have to try to tell the whole story in a couple of hours. That means they can only focus on a few things. Often the apostles, for instance, come across as "Peter, Judas and the rest of them" as if the other ten didn't count for much. The Chosen takes the time to develop the back stories of the characters and even some of the back story of Jesus himself. Thus, it manages to make the familiar stories come more alive in our imaginations.

Dallas Jenkins, who is an Evangelical Protestant, is the producer and moving force behind the whole project. I am happy to say that he is very respectful of the Catholic point of view on a lot of things. I especially like the way he portrays Jesus' mother Mary. They don't pretend that their presentation is historical, and I can see some things that I think clearly are not, but they encourage people to read the gospels for themselves. In fact, I think they're hoping that more people will read the gospels on their own! Just as good science fiction stories weave their plots around plausible projections from known science, "The Chosen" invents plausible background details for the familiar gospel stories in order to bring the gospels to life for us. That's a good thing!

The Movie Nights are open to all ages and I'd especially like to see teens there -- that was when I first read the four Gospels on my own and got to know Jesus in a new way. I have now seen all the episodes from both seasons of "The Chosen" so far and it has, again, breathed new life into my appreciation for the Gospels. I encourage you to attend.

Movie Night


"The Chosen" episode 2
