

Feast of the Ascension

Fr. Fabio and Fr. Richard were away this past week on retreat with all of the priests in the Diocese of Kalamazoo. In lieu of Fr. Fabio's weekly article this reflection is made possible by The National Association of Pastoral Musicians (NPM), a nonprofit association that provides networking and formation opportunities for pastoral musicians across the United States. After the continued joy and glory of the Easter season, we might ask what is the purpose of this particular feast of the Ascension within the Easter season? Isn't it simply a retelling of a historic event?

Centuries ago, St. Leo preached profoundly about the Ascension in two important sermons. First, Leo affirmed that Christ's human nature is now enthroned at the Father's side: "The ascension of Christ thus means our own elevation as well," says Leo. In the second sermon, he asserts that "what formerly had been visible in our Redeemer now took the form of sacred rites..." On the visible scene, the Redeemer is replaced by sacramental signs, which is how we now encounter Christ. Unless Christ departed from us, first having been glorified, we would not have the sacraments. Each Sunday we participate in that presence in the reception of the Body and Blood of the Lord, made present among all of us in the celebration of the Eucharist.

Ours is the human task to reinforce that "making present" in the words we sing, drawing our Easter communities ever more deeply into the call of the Gospel of Matthew, hearing what we ought to do: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them... teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you."

"All you peoples, clap your hands, shout to God with cries of gladness; sing hymns of praise. God reigns over the nations, God sits upon his holy throne." (*Psalm 47: 2, 8b-9*)

May the spirit and faith with which we "shout to God with cries of gladness" inspire our assemblies to go forward with great joy to do the work of Easter.

Special Collection



We invite you to wear red to Mass on this special day which marks the beginning of the Christian church's mission to the world. Wearing red signifies the presence


of the Holy Spirit in our community, and our unity in Christ.
