Time for a Vision Check

Our parish has just entered into its second century of living Catholic faith in the South Haven community. These milestone years often evoke the desire to look back a little, and to look ahead for some significant period. How far have we come? What does the future hold for us, and how can we shape that future so that we will be more faithful, more effective, and more affirming of our faith and our fellow believers?

With the support of the Pastoral Council, Fr. Evelio, and Fr. Richard, you are invited to participate in a simple but engaging listening process that will take place over the next 2-3 months. The first session will be on Wednesday, November 8, from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m. in the Upper Level Meeting Room. There will be sessions in Spanish as well as sessions designed for middle and high schoolers. You will have an opportunity to be heard.

The question for this process is this: What do we think St. Basil should be like in 2035? This is a listening process that will lead to the development of a Vision Statement ("who are we striving to be or become?"), and does not discard the parish Mission Statement.

And what about the 2012 Strategic Plan? It's 11 years old and due for a review and update. If you go to the parish web site and click on the "About" tab, you'll find the full text of that plan. Take a look! Some of its major goals have been accomplished; others appear to have been abandoned, delayed, or diverted; the very intrusive pandemic experience of 2020 certainly had its impact.

To participate in this first Listening Session, please call the parish office. Space is limited to 36 participants per session. This session will be in English and designed for adults. But if you're a high schooler and confirmed, you're a full member of the Church, and you're welcome to this session or any of the others.

What's your vision for St. Basil for, say 2035? We're looking at a new century of parish life, but we don't have to plan all of it at once. Vision 2035 will be a great start!



Prayer Shawl Ministry


Many parishioners have knitted or crocheted over 300 prayer shawls. If you knit or crochet, please consider creating a prayer shawl. To receive
