

Mission El Sitio 2023

In my last article I shared with you my reflection on the events our delegation participated in with the community in El Sitio as they remembered the 40^{th} anniversary of the massacre at Capapayo where many relatives and friends were victims of this terrible event.

I want to thank the many generous parishioners of Saint Catherine in Portage, Saint Basil in South Haven, Our Lady of the Lake in Edwardsburg, and Saint Ann in Cassopolis. Your prayers, your donations of supplies, and financial generosity allowed our delegation to continue to carry out our 23 year mission to support health care and education.

Among our many activities we were able to do the following:

- ▼ Some of our delegates spent three mornings visiting each home in the village. They delivered small boxes of first aid supplies. A census was taken of each family, especially making sure there were no serious health needs and making sure all the young elementary students were going to school.
- A couple of mornings we offered fluoride treatments for the children and teens, offered vision testing, and given glasses for reading.
- Many of the elderly were able to receive a professional massage from one of our delegates.
- ▼ Each day the children were entertained with arts and craft projects: tie-dyeing t-shirts to keep, drawing and doing puzzles, writing letters to students at St. Basil Elementary School, making bracelets with beads and yarn, and playing soccer. They spent an entire afternoon on the soccer field doing team games and challenges that ended in a huge water balloon fight.
- ▼ The delegation had meetings with the teachers of the school, the community leadership committee, the health care committee, and the leadership of a new program for the community hosted at the library.
- We again hosted and paid for a community dinner on the outdoor basketball court where we served 250 meals. The highlight was a small group of children who sang "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star" in perfect English.

In the next bulletin I will give a financial report, and share my reflections on the amazing delegates who represented our parishes in such a wonderful way.

 Algunos de nuestros delegados pasaron tres mañanas visitando cada hogar del pueblo. Entregaron pequeñas cajas con suministros de primeros auxilios. Se hizo un censo de

> cada familia, especialmente para asegurarse de que no hubiera necesidades de salud graves y de que todos los jóvenes estudiantes de primaria asistieran a la escuela.

- ♥ Un par de mañanas ofrecimos tratamientos con flúor para niños y adolescentes, ofrecimos pruebas de la vista y ofrecimos anteojos para leer.
- Muchos de los ancianos pudieron recibir un masaje profesional por parte de uno de nuestros delegados.
- ♥ Cada día, los niños se entretuvieron con proyectos de arte y manualidades: teñir camisetas para guardarlas, dibujar y resolver rompecabezas, escribir cartas a los estudiantes de la escuela primaria
- St. Basil, hacer pulseras con cuentas e hilo y jugar fútbol. Pasaron una tarde entera en la cancha de fútbol haciendo juegos de equipo y desafíos que terminaron en una enorme pelea de globos de agua.
- La delegación se reunió con los maestros de la escuela, el comité de liderazgo comunitario, el comité de atención médica y el liderazgo de un nuevo programa para la comunidad alojado en la biblioteca.
- Nuevamente organizamos y pagamos una cena comunitaria en la cancha de baloncesto al aire libre donde servimos 250 comidas. Lo más destacado fue un pequeño grupo de niños que cantaron "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star" en perfecto inglés.

En el próximo boletín daré un informe financiero y compartiré mis reflexiones sobre los increíbles delegados que representaron a nuestras parroquias de una manera tan maravillosa.


