

- ▶ In the Gospel today we see Jesus and his disciples journeying through Galilee. Jesus is again telling of his coming passion and resurrection but the disciples do not understand. The disciples begin arguing about who is greatest among them. Jesus tells them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." I recently talked with a homeless couple at the pantry and each time I do this I am reminded of how very important rent and utility assistance is. Once you are on the street it is so difficult to get into a good shelter. This month we helped 7 adults and 10 children with rent and 8 adults and 9 children with utility assistance.
