



# **Gospel Reflection**

18th Sunday in Ordinary Time — July 31st Luke 12:13-21

As so often happens, Jesus tells a parable because someone has asked him a question. A man wants him to settle a squabble about an inheritance, but Jesus will have no part of it.

Concern about money prevents people from focusing on the reign of God. The parable of the rich farmer shows how foolish it is to keep piling up possessions. Right when the greedy man is gorging himself on food and drink, he dies. Death prevents any chance of reform.

▶ How important is making money? Jesus knows that we all need enough to live on. Each person's need will be a little bit different. Each family's needs will be a little bit different. But Jesus warns here against piling up money and ignoring what really makes us rich...love of God and love of others.

# **OUTREACH & SOCIAL JUSTICE**

This was the first true Christmas in July experience I had. The past couple of years I donated blood, and although it is giving yourself (quite literally), there wasn't the direct contact with the recipient that I was looking for. I too often take the shy, indirect road when giving, which is based both on modesty but also on fear.



This year, I volunteered to serve at the Blanchet House because no one had signed up yet for the particular time slot. Even though I was the only one signed up and was nervous about being in a group of all "strangers", I did it anyway. It was awesome.

I knew so little about what actually went on at the

Blanchet House. I was shocked at the organization of the process and impressed by the facilities. I was stationed to plate food, and therefore did not have contact with the homeless being served but getting to know the men that live and work at the house was just as important. The Blanchet House serves recovering addicts, and those people feed the homeless as an exchange for room and board.

I also had a chance to chat with some young people from our parish. It was enlightening to hear their experiences and perceptions of serving the needy.

I, too often, get caught up in the "busy-ness" of my life, and think I couldn't possibly fit one more thing in. But, God shows me over and over that when I feel like I have the least, that is when I need to give. It is a beautiful mystery of Grace - giving what you don't think you can spare yields a replenishment beyond quantification.

Lastly, I want to say that one of the best things about Christmas in July is its organization - Holy Family parishioners get to take advantage of a calendar of events that is already scheduled!! I can't recommend participation enough. It's easy and fun, but most of all it is spiritually enriching. Do yourself a favor, and plan to participate!
