Dear Holy Family Parishioners,

Last weekend the Parish computer system was infiltrated by a ransomware virus attack. Ransomware locks up systems and encrypts their files and backups making them inaccessible. The virus then demands a ransom payment to decrypt them. We contacted the email addresses the virus provided to see what the demands were, but we did not receive a reply.

The result is that the Parish has lost its database and files, including our bulletin layout; hence, today's slimmed-down version. Please be patient with us, as it will take quite an effort to recreate files and information.

Ransomware attacks generally do not go after individual information, so it is unlikely that parishioners' personal information is in jeopardy. No financial data was compromised. All financial data is kept on a separate server or, as in the case of our app or website giving, is hosted by a secure, outside processor that was not affected by the ransomware.

We are working with our IT contractor to get our computer system running again with more secure firewalls and recoverable back-up data in the cloud for future needs.

Leslie and Ella and I, along with our neighbor girl Joselyn who joined Ella for VBS, spent part of an afternoon working at the St. Vincent dePaul pantry on SE Cornwell St. This proved to be a particularly meaningful experience due to the fact that we had direct interaction with the community members being served. Leslie or I interviewed each recipient to find out a little about their situation and needs, and then went back into the pantry to fill bags or boxes with food and toiletries. The interview process and the freedom to make our decisions as to what went into each bag/box based on the information shared resulted in a very unique sense of connection with those being served and a deeper understanding of what life might be like for them during their difficult period.

It was really exciting to see the girls get all fired up when we came back and told them the story we had just heard and watch them go into action grabbing the things this individual had indicated needing. One recipient had twin girls that

were to stay with him on the coming weekend, so our girls of similar age were especially enthusiastic about putting together some meals that these girls would enjoy.

We were very taken with the sense of pride that some had, not wanting to take anything more than they actually needed and certainly not anything that they wouldn't use. The other gift was the sense of gratitude displayed along with a thread of hope that they could get through their troubled times because they weren't alone or forgotten.

Overall the experience made us grateful for how blessed we have been in our own lives, and more compassionate to those we encounter who are less fortunate - always ready to look them in the eyes and offer them a sincere hello if nothing else.
