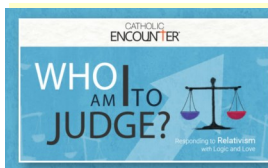

The Mission of Holy Family Catholic Parish is to be a welcoming faith community grounded in Gospel values and dedicated to making God known to our members and all who enter our doors. We foster positive relationships with God and one another through active participation in the ministries of worship, education, celebration, and service to all.

Session Two was entitled "Recovering the Basics: Virtue and Friendship." It tells us that we need to develop our skills or habits in becoming the best person we can be and we do that by growing in virtue and friendship in our lives. Man is ultimately made for friendship. Our life is all about relationships and how do we nurture and take care of those as a person. Virtues are the skills we need to live our relationships well. The Catechism defines them as habitual and firm disposition to do good (CCC1803). Just as with any skills we have like driving a car, we need practice and consistency to be able to hone it and sharpen it. We need to persevere and continuously work on developing our virtues and friendships in our life. When we confess our sins, we confess things we have done and also what we failed to do. Morality is not just about avoiding acts that can hurt others and ourselves. We can hurt ourselves and others by not doing something – by not being the best person we can be. So the goal of morality is not to just "obey the commandments" but to grow in love and virtue. Living

the moral life takes a lot of effort and grace. For this reason, we have to practice consistently and intentionally; we have to learn from the examples of the saints; and we need to pray and ask for God's guidance and grace to be the best person we can be.

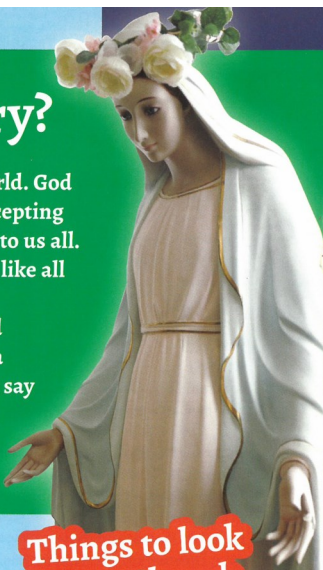
OCTOBER IS THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

KIDS QUESTION

Why do we pray to Mary?

Mothers are special. They bring new life into the world. God asked Mary to be Jesus' mother, and she said yes. By accepting God's plan for her life, Mary became a spiritual mother to us all. When we pray to Mary, she talks to God for us, because like all mothers she loves us and wants us to be close to God.

One of the ways we honor Mary's faithfulness to God is through a prayer called the Rosary. The Rosary uses a combination of prayers you probably already know! We say the Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be in a special combination. Between the prayers we think about important events in Jesus' life.



Things to look for at Church

Count all the places you see Mary. Look for her in stained glass, paintings and statues.

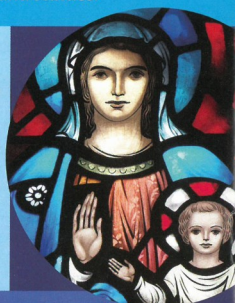
Try this!

Sit down as a family and try praying the Rosary. Say the prayers together or take turns. Don't worry if you get distracted; keep trying!

- 1 Make the **Sign of the Cross** and pray the **Apostles' Creed**
- 2 Pray an **Our Father**
- 3 Pray three **Hail Marys** and one **Glory Be**
- 4 Announce the mystery and pray the **Our Father**
- 5 Pray 10 **Hail Marys** and one **Glory Be**

Repeat until you have completed the circle.
Pray the **Hail, Holy Queen**.

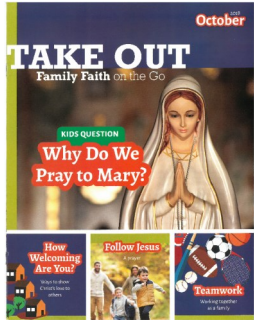

Gospel Reflection

The 26th Sunday of Ordinary Time

September 30th—Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

The second part of today's Gospel contains a strong message for those who share the responsibility of fostering faith. It is indeed an awesome responsibility. Today's Gospel reminds us that faith is a lifelong journey toward God. We don't always get it all or even get it right. But we pray for the grace to acknowledge and build upon even the smallest signs of faith, in ourselves and in others. There are plenty of obstacles that might prevent the growth of faith. Let us pray that we are not contributing to the obstacles that might hinder another person's faith in Jesus.

As you gather as a family, observe that there are things in our lives that nurture our faith and things that can hinder it. Talk about some of the things that nurture our faith—healthy family relationships, healthy friendships, good literature, and so on. Name some of the things that might be an obstacle to faith—unhealthy relationships, scandals, and so on. Observe that Jesus teaches us in today's Gospel that we are to do everything we can to help one another have faith in Jesus and do all that we can to avoid creating obstacles that might hinder another person's faith.
