- Nebraska Abortion Rates Rose in 2024: Defending the dignity of every human person is more important than ever. July 12, 2025

All human beings are created in God's image and deserve protection at every stage of life, especially the



most defenseless: unborn children. According to the most recent Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services abortion statistics reports for 2024, Nebraska saw a 7.6% increase in abortions, totaling 2,501 abortions.

Most abortions were performed for non-medical reasons, with many citing financial or social pressures. Most abortions took place between 6-8 weeks gestation, and women from 14 different states had abortions in Nebraska.

Our response as Catholics must be, as Pope Benedict XVI said in his encyclical, <u>Love in</u> Truth:

"Love is an extraordinary force which leads people to opt for courageous and generous engagement in the field of justice and peace." - Pope Benedict XVI

An unexpected or under-supported pregnancy can be overwhelming. A woman facing that situation, **who is already a mother and whose child is already present**, is herself a human person whom Catholics must always approach with love and support.

- We must continue to speak clearly that abortion intentionally and unjustly ends the life of a living human person.
- We must walk with moms in need, ensuring they have support, friendship, and resources.

-Novena to Saints Anne & Joachim - July 17-25

Saints Joachim and Anne are powerful intercessors for married couples, expectant mothers, and married couples who are having difficulty conceiving, as well as people who are aging. Make copies of the "Faith and Perseverance" novena to Saints Anne and Joachim and pray the novena from July 17-25 in preparation for their memorial on July 26.

-Dobbs Anniversary

In his message for the June 24th anniversary of *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, the decision that overturned *Roe v. Wade*, <u>Bishop Thomas urged the faithful</u> to advocate for greater protections for preborn children. <u>The full statement is available</u> as Word and PDF files in English and Spanish. -Pro-abortion Guidance Rescinded

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) rescinded guidance that had attempted to require abortions in certain circumstances under the Emergency Medical Treatment and Labor Act (EMTALA). Bishop Daniel Thomas, chair of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, welcomed the news.
