

See the moon and stars.


Gaze at the beauty of Earth's greenings.

R: An unbreakable bond in the Spirit that binds as one all brothers and sisters, transcending class, color, culture, religion, race, and gender, that treats no personal preference, no physical or spiritual difference as aberration or handicap.

L: One has been born among us Who heralds such liberation. Human liberation and the liberation of all creation have taken flesh among us and in Spirit dwell with us.

R: Holy is all creation and creatures who made this happen. Blessed are we when we give birth to the Word made flesh in us.
