## Classroom Happenings

Another fun and exciting week in third grade! We finished reading our first novel, Charlotte's Web and celebrated by watching the movie. The children really seemed to enjoy reading this book and watching the movie. The story seems to be timeless. This week
 they will have the opportunity to be Charlotte and create webs of their own. Inside the web they need to place a word that best describes them. They will also need to write a few sentences explaining why they chose this particular word. Our next novel will be

Charlie and the Chocolate Factory by Rold Dahl. This is the first year I am reading this novel with my class and I am excited to see how they respond to it. I am expecting to start this novel after Halloween. We should finish it in time for the movie release in December. For the rest of October, we will be reading Halloween themed stories and continuing with lesson five in our Journeys anthology, a story about Roberto Clemente. The children will be focusing on cause and effect as well as the importance of sequencing events in a biography. In addition to reading, the class will be working on various writing pieces, also Halloween themed. In Grammar, we will be focusing on plural nouns and the many rules that go with them. Since this is a short week, there is no spelling. You should expect to see grammar pages coming home in place of spelling homework.

By now you all should have seen the letter detailing our multiplication ice cream sundae challenge. Please read over the letter and sign and return the bottom portion as soon as possible. Beginning this Friday, the children will given a speed drill on a particular fact. They will have two minutes to complete it. In order to pass and move to the next one, they must get at least 35 out of 50 correct. Once they pass a test, they earn a part of their sundae. Students can not move on to the next fact until they pass the current one. Do not worry - they can retake each test as many times as they need. I have done this for several years, and I have yet to have someone not earn a sundae. The goal is for them to become fluent in their facts- and have some fun earning a sundae while doing it. This Friday we start easy with the 0's and the 1's. I don't for see any issues with passing this one. The following Friday will be the 2 's - and so on.

In science, we have moved on to. much for fun and interesting unit - electric charges and magnetism. The children really love this one and it is easier to understand. In Social Studies we are working through a quick unit on Economics before moving into my favorite unit - Early Communities- which focuses on Native Americans and early explorers.

The first book report/project also when home this week. Your child must select a biography to read. This reading can be counted as reading for their reading log. The report and project are due in class no later than November 20th.

On Halloween, I'd like to provide a special breakfast for the class. I will be getting bagels for them but if any one would like to supply juice, fruit or a special treat, please email me and let me know so I know what to expect. Thank you in advance for helping to make this a fun day.
