Valentine's Day

Valentine's Day originated as a Christian feast day celebrating a martyr named Saint Valentine. Saint Valentine was imprisoned in the Third Century for preaching to Christians in the streets of Rome. Throughout the years, Valentine's Day has changed from cultural and religious traditions to romance and commercial aspects throughout all regions of the world.

Presidents' Day, also known as Washington's birthday, started with President Abraham Lincoln deciding to honor President George Washington's birthday. President Lincoln originally issued a proclamation declaring February 22nd a day of celebration honoring President Washington, but it now honors all presidents. A federal holiday for February 22nd was officially passed into law in 1879 and was then extended to cover all federal employees in 1885. Presidents' Day is now celebrated on the third Monday in February because of the Uniform Monday Holiday Bill.






Drex's Corner




Welcome, Mrs. Paul!


The Senior class sponsored the annual Winter Dance with the Argentinian Students on Saturday, February 4.





Tommie Meyers-Palmer




