



From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners.

It gives me great joy to share with you the State of the Parish Report 2024. This report covers July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024 fiscal year. It is an overview of who we are as a parish, the good works accomplished by parishioners, and the finances of the parish. We have statistics on the various aspects of our parish life including the sacraments, liturgical ministries, religious education, social services, parish ministries, and many more. I will highlight a few of these in this introduction.

As a family, we have been blessed by God who continues to grant increase and success to the work of our hands. Our parish continues to grow in number and strength. We enjoyed the support of parishioners who used their gifts, time, and treasure to support our parish thereby doing the work of evangelization. We are putting our faith into action as we assisted over 26,000 individuals during the year through our social service ministry. We visited the sick, we fed the hungry, we mourned with those who mourned, we rejoiced with those who rejoiced, and we were all things to all peoples so that God is praised in our community.
