The Kindergarten students have been enjoying getting to know all their new friends. They created wonderful "All About Me" people and have been sharing all of their favorite things with their classmates.




This was a very exciting week for the First Graders. They are spending time getting to know one another and the routine of the classroom. They've read the book, "If You Take a Mouse to School" by Laura Numeroff and completed their own version of the story. This fun story helped the students feel enthusiastic about the idea of going back to school.

Third grade is currently working on rounding in different place values. We are also working on using a variety of strategies and properties for mental math.



The second grade is so excited to be reading our first story, Henry and Mudge, which is making us think about finding the perfect pet! We are also excited about participating in our Literacy Centers. The favorite so far is the Spelling word choice board!

The fourth graders have been busy getting to know their classmates. They are writing about how they are each unique individuals. We are all God's special creations.

The fifth grade students are learning all about maps in Social Studies. We also observed Patriot Day by reading and discussing the poem, "The Little Chapel that Stood". The poem tells the story of St. Paul's chapel and its importance to first responders.

In Social Studies the seventh graders are learning about ancient Mesoamerican and South American societies such as the Olmec, Maya, Aztec, and Inca civilizations.
