

From Fr. Dan ...

Today, on the Epiphany, we celebrate that the Light of the World, Jesus Christ, is revealed to all people and all are called to follow The Light. However, there is still much darkness that persists in our world. While we spend the Christmas season reflecting on the newborn Christ child, we should not ignore the reality that millions of children have not and will not have the chance to come into the world as Jesus did. On Friday, January 20, the annual MARCH FOR LIFE will take place in Washington, D.C., as a powerful statement against that horrific reality. Even though taking the life of a pre-born child is, thankfully, no longer considered a "right" that is part of the defining



document of our nation, our Constitution, it IS still a part of the darkness that envelopes our nation, and many throughout the world. Some are so far into that darkness that they would actually think of ending a child's life as



"health care." There is still MUCH to be done to manifest The Light, Jesus Christ, in our world. You have an opportunity to be part of that Light on January 20, as St. Catherine Labouré Parish is sponsoring a bus to Washington D.C. for the March (details and contact information can be found later in this bulletin). For those unable to attend the March in person, please join with the Marchers in spirit by praying for a greater respect for all human life, in all stages and conditions, here and throughout our world; praying for those millions of children denied the gift of life; and praying for those still steeped in darkness who support the sin of abortion.

Jesus came into our world to show us the love of God. Hopefully, we strive to continually open our hearts and minds to that love and to reflect that love to others!

Although we are now one week into a new calendar year, it's not too late to make some resolutions that can have a life-changing impact. "New Year's Resolutions" are typically designed to eliminate negative elements (like bad habits, for example) and to build on positive elements (like better health through diet and exercise, for example). Hopefully, for any Catholic Christian, some of those "New Year's Resolutions" pertain to ways to improve our relationship to God and His Church. For example, one could strive to:

- * be more attentive to prayer in one's life setting more / better time aside for that activity each day.
- * read scripture more often (which can be a form of prayer in itself)
- * give the Mass greater emphasis in our lives both attending Mass and also actively participating (by doing things such as singing the hymns, listening attentively, and joining in the congregational responses and prayers)
- * make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation periodically, throughout the year.
- * making use of our parish's FORMED subscription for education in the faith as well as spiritually-healthy and enriching entertainment. (visit signup.formed.org and select our parish name)

Adopting such resolutions for a new year will help to improve one's well-being at all different levels — and not just for the short-term, but for eternity!.

EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING

There is a ancient tradition, as we celebrate the visit of the wise men to the new-born Christ child, that Christians ask God's blessing on their homes. The mark of this blessing is usually written in chalk above the main door (and possibly other places throughout the home). It is to remind us throughout the year, that Jesus should be a daily guest in our home, in our comings and goings, in our conversations, in our work and play, and in our joys and sorrows. The mark of the blessing is: 20 + C + M + B + 23.

The letters C, M, B have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of three magi / wise men: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. (This interpretation links the invocation of God's blessing on one's home with the gospel event we read of on the Epiphany.) However, perhaps a more significant meaning is that these three letters are abbreviations for the Latin words <u>Christus Mansionem Benedicat</u>, which means: "May Christ bless this house." The "+" signs represent the cross. The "20" and "23" are obviously the numerals of the current year.





Disciple Maker Index

Over the past month we have updated the Saint Catherine Labouré parish family on the Diocese of Pittsburgh partnership with Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI) to provide parishes with the tools and resources needed to create pastoral plans focused on Evangelization, Hospitality, and Mission. On Ash Wednesday, February 22, a 75-question survey instrument, the Disciple Maker Index (DMI), will be made available to all Saint Catherine Labouré parishioners via the internet or paper copy, allowing parishioners the opportunity to reflect



upon (1.) individual spiritual growth and (2.) engagement with our parish. Bishop Zubik has asked all parishes in the Diocese of Pittsburgh to participate. Results from our parish survey will be available in the April/May 2023 timeframe. All responses will be confidential. Saint Catherine Labouré will only receive information about our parish community as a whole. The information gathered from the DMI will be a valuable planning tool for our parish as we develop goals and action items to help us grow in discipleship as we lead others back to the church. Between now and Ash Wednesday we will continue to update you on this important initiative. We hope you will plan on participating.

JESUS



Jesus started his earthly ministry by pouring into twelve men. That original small group went on to evangelize the whole world. Our faith is nurtured and deepened in small community.

A small group consists of 6-12 people who commit to meeting regularly with the specific purpose of growing in their faith together. Every small group incorporates Scripture, prayer, and service, but each group develops its own flavor based on how they balance those three aspects.

A small group can look like a formal weekly Bible study. But it could also be a group of moms who meet at a park and pray together while the kids play. Or the Prayer Shawl ministry where the members have fellowship while knitting together and praying for the recipients of their handiwork.

Many groups are official ministries of the parish, such as Alpha, where members are assigned to the group and get to know each other over time. Other groups are more informal, where people who already know each other decide to start meeting regularly for Scripture study or prayer.

The hallmarks of a small group are the commitment of the members to meeting regularly, learning more about their faith, and growing together in love of God and love of neighbor. It is the goal of the Small Group Initiative here at Saint Catherine Labouré to connect every parishioner to the small group that is right for them.

Go to https://diopitt.org/compliance and follow the appropriate steps if you are a new user or if you already have an existing account.

In order to be eligible to volunteer or work in the parish or school it is mandatory that you complete the Diocesan Safe Environment Process prior to employment or participating in any parish activity.


