
SACRAMENTAL LIFE

From Fr. Dan...

This Sunday, as we celebrate Pentecost, we commemorate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles — the Spirit that would empower them to go out into the world and continue the work of Christ. Receiving that Holy Spirit made such a dramatic difference in the minds and hearts of the Apostles that it is often referred to as the birthday of the Church. Once they received that Spirit of God and all the gifts that go with it (wisdom, courage / strength / fortitude, understanding, knowledge, counsel / right judgment, piety / reverence, fear of the Lord / awe and wonder), they began to understand themselves in a new way, not just as followers of Christ, but as actual



members of His Body. Jesus was no longer working as one, physical person in the world, but from that point on, He was working through a whole body of people. That Body (the Church) would continue to grow throughout time as more people became part of it through Baptism, sharing in Christ's Body and Blood in the Eucharist, and receiving the fullness of that same Holy Spirit in Confirmation.

Although the same Holy Spirit, the same "third person of the Holy Trinity," comes to all of us, it affects us each in different ways. The gifts of that Spirit are given in different amounts and for different purposes, but always to bring about not only our greater good as individuals, but the greater good of the entire Body of Christ.

The fact that you are reading this bulletin shows that the Holy Spirit is prompting you to take an interest in the life and health of this parish, this local part of the Church — and you are responding to that prompting! Hopefully you read the bulletin regularly, as that is ONE of the ways (the parish website, SCLPGH.ORG, is another way, as is signing up for our parish Flocknotes) to discover various opportunities over time to experience what it means to belong to the Church — whether it's through participating in various social events, spiritual activities, educational / enrichment opportunities, or by giving of yourself and applying your gifts in various ministries and volunteer service situations.

Our parish Mission Statement is to "Learn Jesus, Love Jesus and Live Jesus, and to invite others to share in the Sacramental Life of the Catholic Faith." We are blessed as a parish to have so many opportunities to live out that Mission. Our energetic and enthusiastic Parish Pastoral Council, and the various committees formed around that Council (Communication & Public Relations; Discipleship; Hospitality & Fellowship; Outreach & Evangelization; Safety, Buildings & Grounds; and Worship), are always ready to welcome the participation and input of new people. The work of those committees has already had a significant impact on the life of this parish, with much more to experience as we more forward. Your involvement could have an important effect on the work of whatever committee your interests and gifts might lead you to. Enlisting the help of the "Nature of Fire" evangelization ministry team has also helped to re-kindle our Youth Ministry program, establish a Young Adult Ministry, and has organized several parish-wide (and inter-parish) evangelization events — all of which help to enliven this faith community and will hopefully, as we move forward, draw more people to embrace our parish mission.

Hopefully more people of our parish will get/stay connected and informed; be open to the Holy Spirit; respond to the Spirit's nudge to get involved; and experience a richer, fuller life of faith!

Let us pray that each of us will work with the Holy Spirit and allow the Spirit to continue to work in and through us so that we may carry on the work of Christ, just as the Apostles did, and continue to grow as His Body, here and now.

Last week, Bishop Zubik announced who would be the new pastor of St. Catherine Labouré Parish, effective July10, 2023. It will be **Fr. Jeffrey M. Craig**. Fr. Jeff was ordained for the Diocese of Pittsburgh in 2020 and has been serving as the Parochial Vicar of Regina Coeli parish in the North Hills. (This parish was formed from three former parishes covering the areas of Bellevue, Emsworth, and Franklin Park.) He is devout, young, energetic, enthusiastic, and smart. The Bishop is obviously confident, as am I, that he will be a wonderful shepherd for this parish community.

If you'd like to get to know Fr. Jeff a little better, in advance of his coming here, there is a YOUTUBE interview that he gave when he was first ordained, in which he talks about his faith, his background, and his call to priesthood. It's titled: Getting to Know Your Clergy & Your Faith: Father Jeff (the actual address is: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Exjp0XB1Yns). There is also a more recent YOUTUBE program in which Fr. Jeff was interviewed by the Benedictine priest, Boniface Hicks, OSB. That one is called: The ENCOURAGING faith journey of Fr Jeff Craig (the actual address is: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=btVdhfOOOCc).

Fr. Jeff has already visited our parish, met the staff and had a tour of all our buildings and grounds. He is excited and eager to get his feet on the ground here!

Also, last week, Bishop Zubik made it official that I would be moving to **St. Raphael the Archangel Parish** as a Senior Parochial Vicar. That parish is composed of three former parishes covering Scott Township, Greentree, and Carnegie. I am well familiar with that area, and one of the former parishes, Sts. Simon and Jude, as I was the pastor of that parish about 12 years ago. Change always presents some challenges, but also brings new possibilities, new perspective, new relationships and new experiences. I'm looking forward to this next step on my journey of priesthood!

A Message from Sister M. Faith, Pastoral Associate

A minstrel is one who sings love songs and then moves on to sing for others in another place. That image was shared in one of my scripture classes given by the late Fr. Demetrius Dumm, OSB. It's a wonderful description of who a religious sister is and what she does.

I have been fortunate to be a minstrel, serving as Pastoral Associate at St. Louise de Marillac and now at St. Catherine Laboure' for almost 12 years. I have enjoyed singing God's love songs in my own unique way. I have been a listener, connector, spiritual/pastoral guide, visitor to the sick, lector at daily Mass, bereavement companion, angel tree coordinator, leader and participant in small and large groups, and hopefully a wisdom figure.

As a result of neurological health issues and discernment, I will not be serving in the parish as of July 1, 2023. I have heard the Lord calling me to sing His love songs at Our Lady of the Sacred Heart Convent in Moon Township, PA. I will continue to work with our Felician Associates, i.e. Christian men and women who are drawn to our Franciscan spirit, desire more association with the Felician Sisters and commit to living out our mission of "cooperating with Christ in the spiritual renewal of the world," wherever they live. I will also have more personal time to pursue things that I enjoy and that renew my health.

The relationships formed here will continue in my heart. I am so grateful for the pastors, priests, deacons, staff, members of organizations/committees and many volunteers that I worked with in renewing the kingdom of God. I am grateful for all of the people I have met along the way. You have enriched my life. God bless you, strengthen you, guide you and love you into more aliveness in Him. 

This summer, the Appalachia Work Camp will be building two homes, 2 additions and 4 decks. It was a difficult trip to Kentucky this April. Our contractors had to choose between several families desperately in need of a home. They met with Jessica Baker who had lost their home to flooding in Brethitt County last year. Jessica is now living in a shed and small trailer on the family's lot where her home once stood with her mom, two siblings and disabled uncle. Unfortunately, because her lot is in the flood plain, the state currently will not allow new construction on their property. They will, for now, have to continue living in their shed, or as Jessica called it, their cabin.

The next stop was Jennifer and Rodney's property. During the flood and torrential rains, the wall of water coming off of the back hillside washed under their trailer and washed the front deck off the trailer and down into the creek. The trailer had a lot of water damage inside and out. Jessica was home alone and thought that she was going to be washed over the hillside in the trailer. She was terrified. Unfortunately, we are not able to build them a home on their lot as it is too small and dangerously close to the road.

Our next stop was to meet JD & Christine. Their trailer was completely washed away in last year's flooding. JD's son's trailer on the hill behind them was not damaged but had to be moved as the property was heavily damaged and washed away. An aunt gave them a piece of her property and we will build JD & Christine a home on that property next to his son's newly located trailer.

We then headed to Owsley County to meet with Christopher & Jessica and their two month old baby Lilly, named after Jessica's mom who passed away last year. They have been living in Christopher's late grandfather's home for several years now. Their current home is wooden, dilapidated, unsafe and has no water or sewage. Christopher has spent many weeks clearing his property and making space for a possible new home. We were excited to tell them that we would be back in July to build them a new home....one with running water, a septic system, and a bathroom.



We will also build an addition for Krystal and Ray, a bedroom for their daughter Kaylie. Their trailer is very small and they asked if we could build an addition to give them more room.

The last visit was to meet Elizabeth Dulley. She had some major water damage to her trailer and we will make some changes to the roof and do repairs for her.




