This is roughly the average that we have been bringing in annually in recent memory. So far this year, the number of those who have seriously inquired about becoming Catholic through OCIA is forty! Yes, you read that right, 40! We are so thankful for the amazing ways that the Holy Spirit continues to build up and transform our parish into a parish that is clearly missionary in proclaiming Christ and putting God first!

It is with this in mind that I want to tell you about the Order of Christian Initiation for Adults (OCIA). Perhaps you know it by its former name, RCIA, but the heart of the program remains the same: it is the beautiful and intentional process through which individuals are brought into full communion with the Catholic Church.

OCIA is for those who are seeking. It is for the unbaptized, the baptized Christian from another tradition, and even for Catholics who have not yet received all their sacraments. It is a journey of discovery and discernment, a time to explore the teachings of the Church, to deepen one's relationship with Jesus Christ, and to find a spiritual home.

But OCIA is not just for those who are entering the Church; it is for all of us. The program relies on the witness and support of our entire parish. It is a shared journey. By participating as sponsors, catechists, or simply as welcoming parishioners, we ourselves are renewed in our faith and reminded of the profound mystery we celebrate each week.

OCIA is a beautiful, transformative process. It is a testament to the fact that our God is a God of new beginnings, a God who is always calling us closer. It is a chance for our parish to live out the Great Commission, to go and make disciples of all nations, beginning right here in our own community.

I invite you to prayerfully consider how you might be a part of this journey. Do you know someone who is curious about the Catholic faith? Invite them to learn more about OCIA. Are you yourself a baptized Catholic who is missing a sacrament? We would love to have you join us.

OCIA is a vital part of our parish life. It is the living, breathing reality of our mission to evangelize and to form disciples. Let us open our hearts and our doors to those whom the Lord is calling to Himself, and let us be a community that joyfully welcomes.
