Parish Pastoral Council Officers

The Parish Pastoral Council (“Council”) is comprised of twelve individuals from the Parish that serve to advise the Pastor and support the Parish Staff to investigate, consider and recommend pastoral initiatives to further the mission of the Parish Faith Community as an extension of the Mission of Jesus. The main objective of the Council is to embrace and promote the pastoral activity and stewardship of the Parish. The Council advises and assists the Pastor in exercising leadership through planning, setting goals and priorities, coordination, motivation, support and evaluation.

Council members serve three (3) year terms that run from September 1st to August 31st. Each Spring, the Council creates a selection committee to identify and recommend replacements for those Council members whose terms are expiring.
